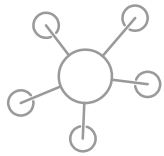

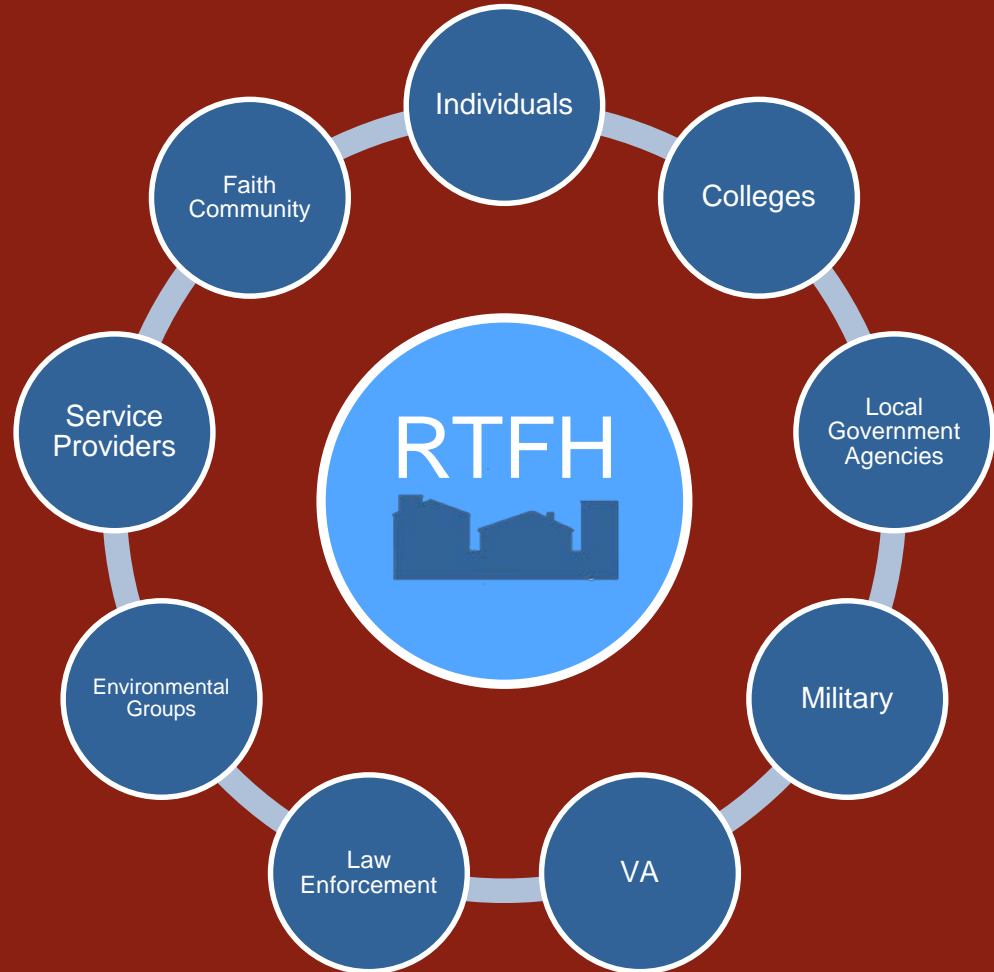
About the WeAllCount

San Diego's Annual Point-in-Time Count

- ▶ HUD Mandated (unfunded)
 - ▶ Last 10 days of January nationally
 - ▶ Annual Homeless Assessment Report to Congress (AHAR)
 - ▶ Entire County – All cities and unincorporated areas
1. Unsheltered “Street Count”
 2. Sheltered Count (via HMIS)
 3. Survey

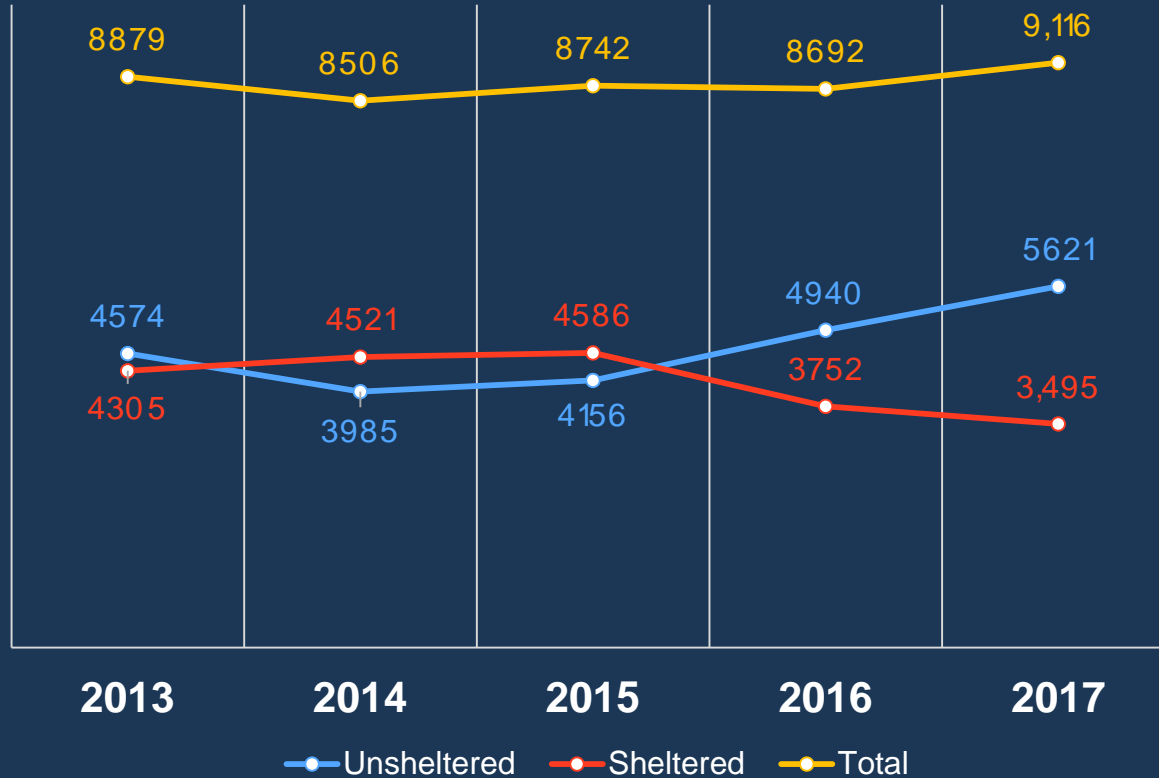

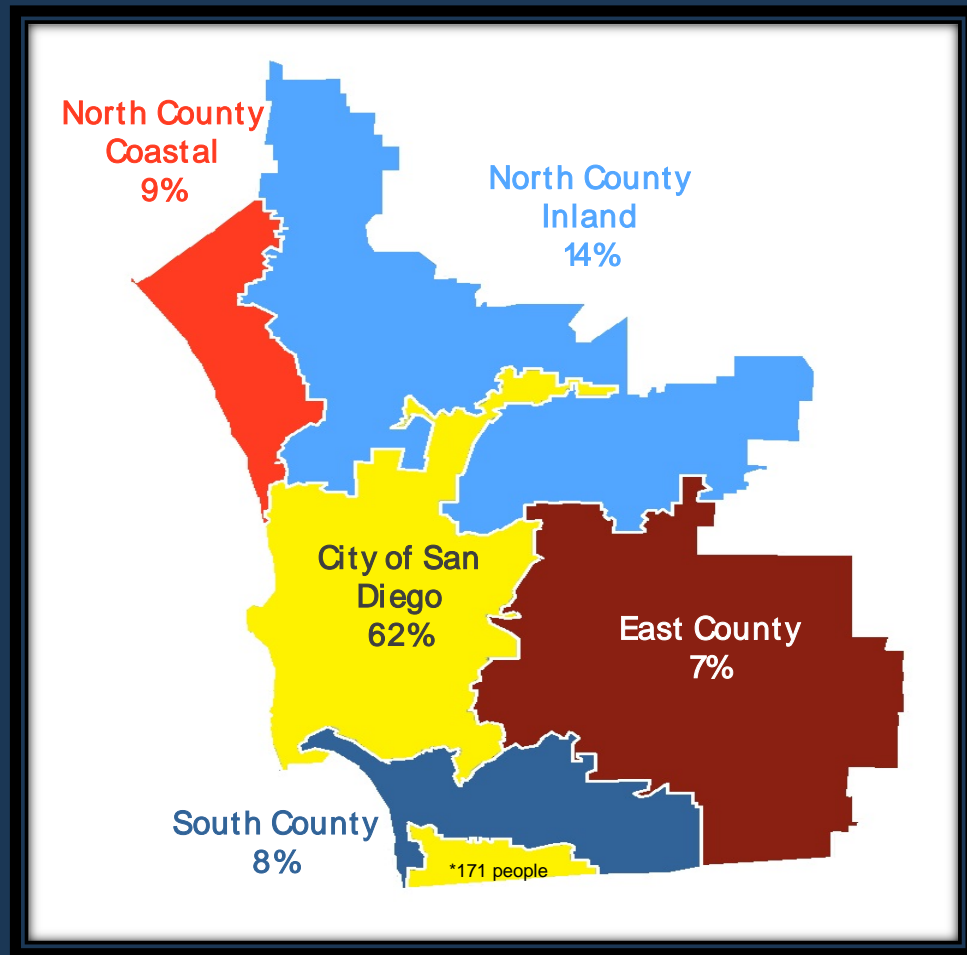
Regional 5-Year Trends

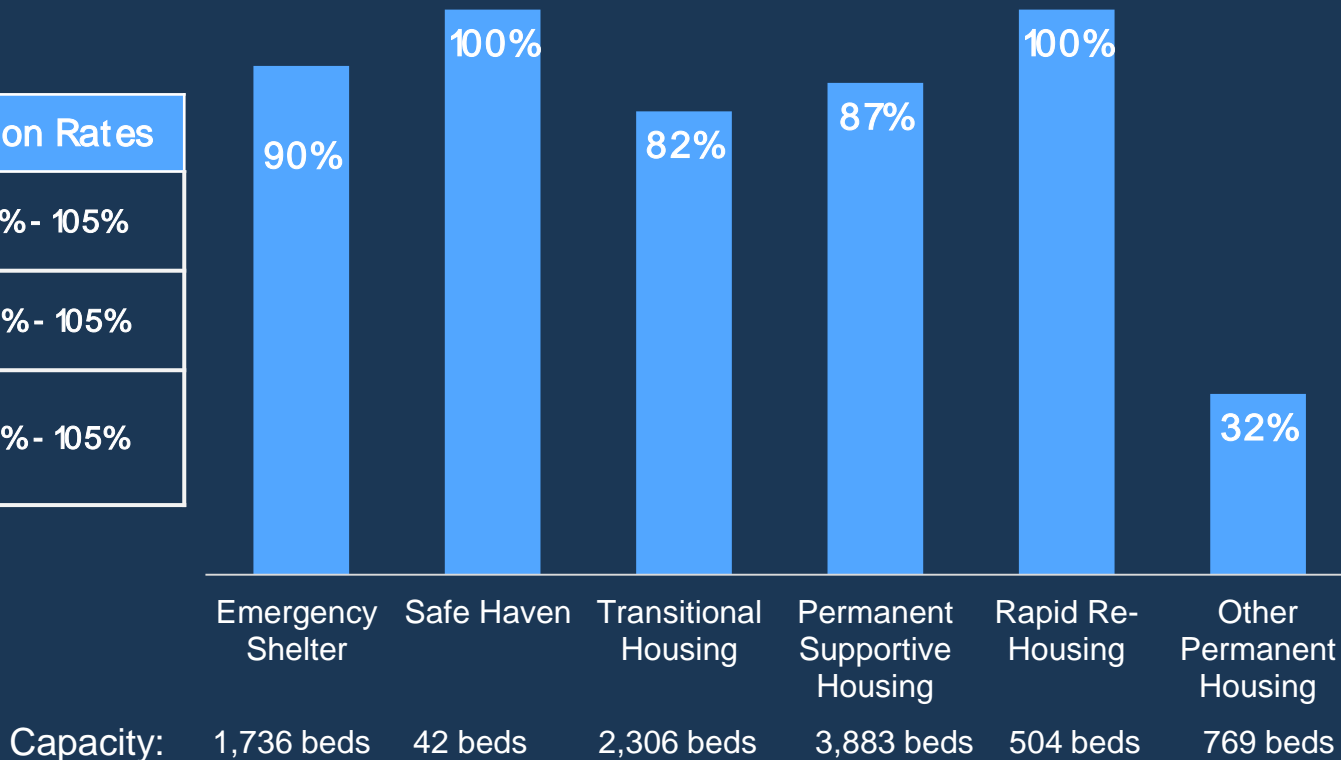

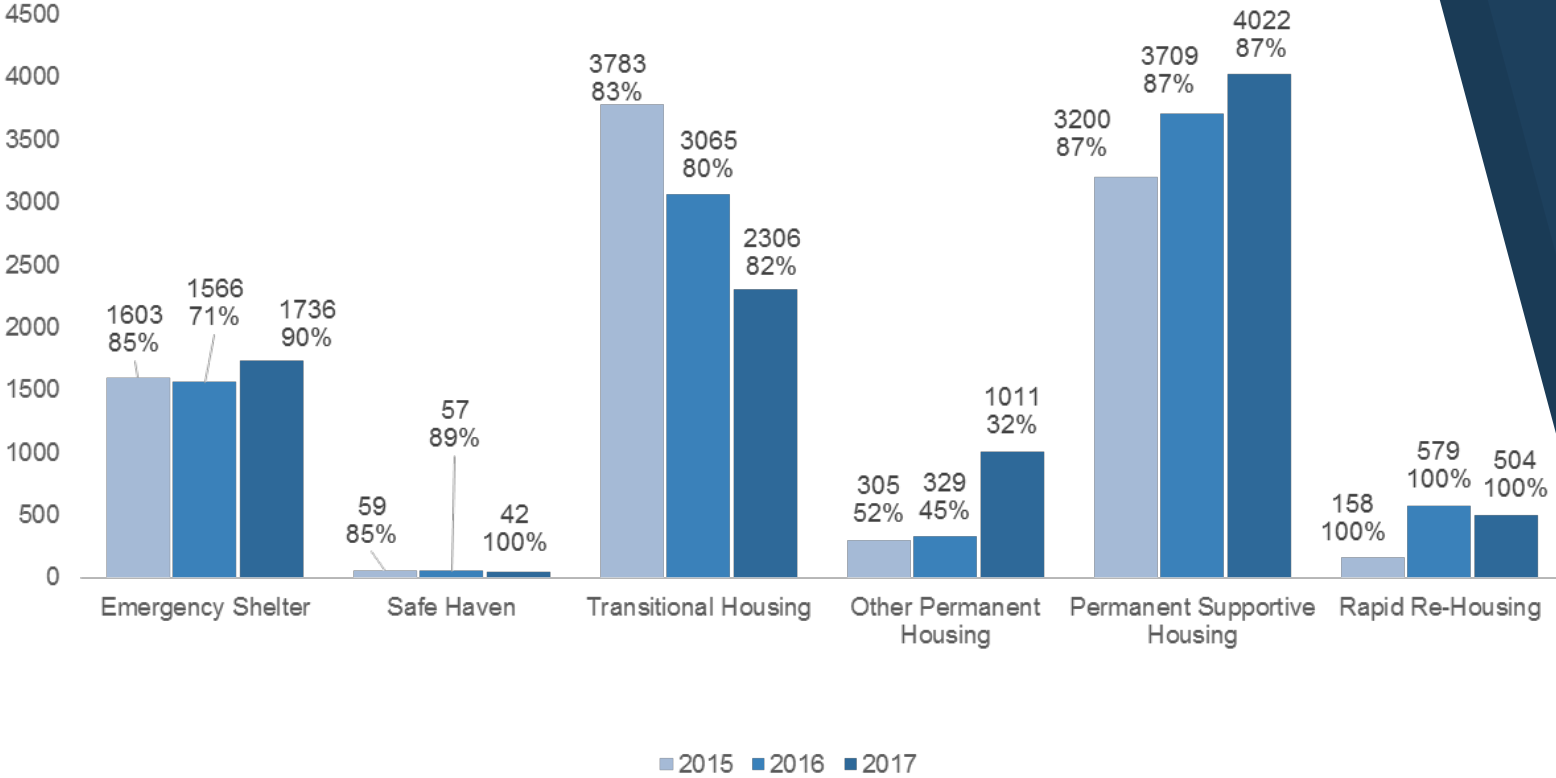

Bed Inventory by Year





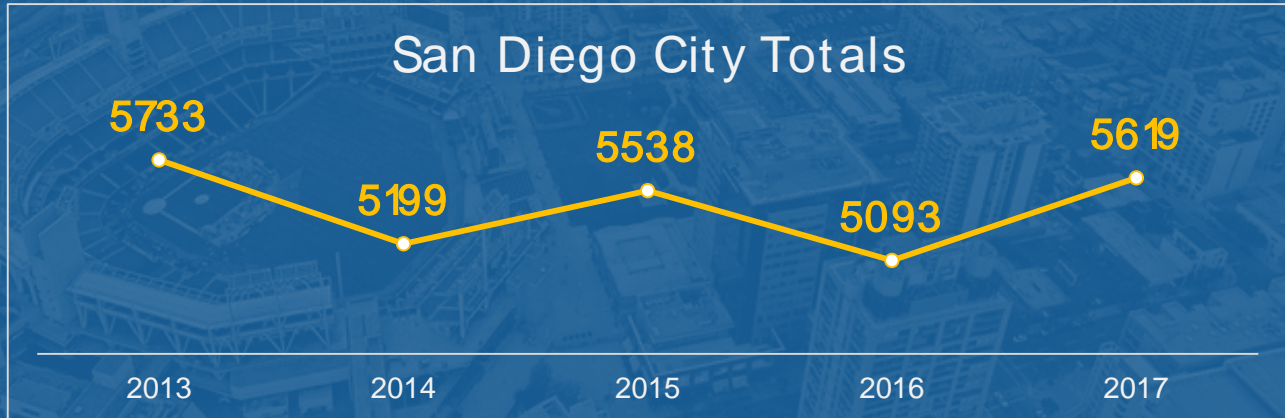

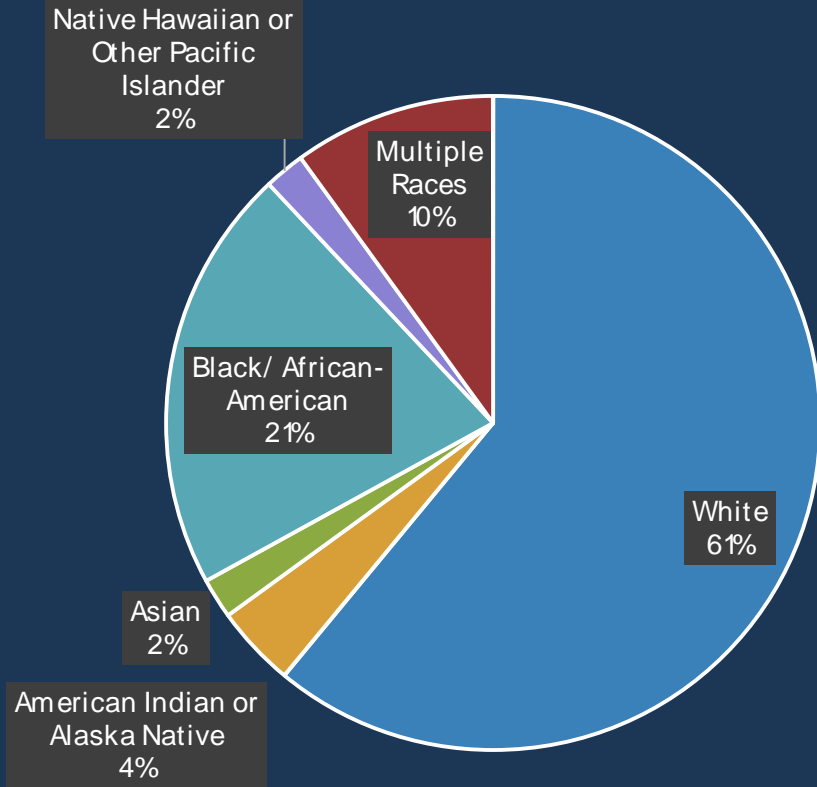

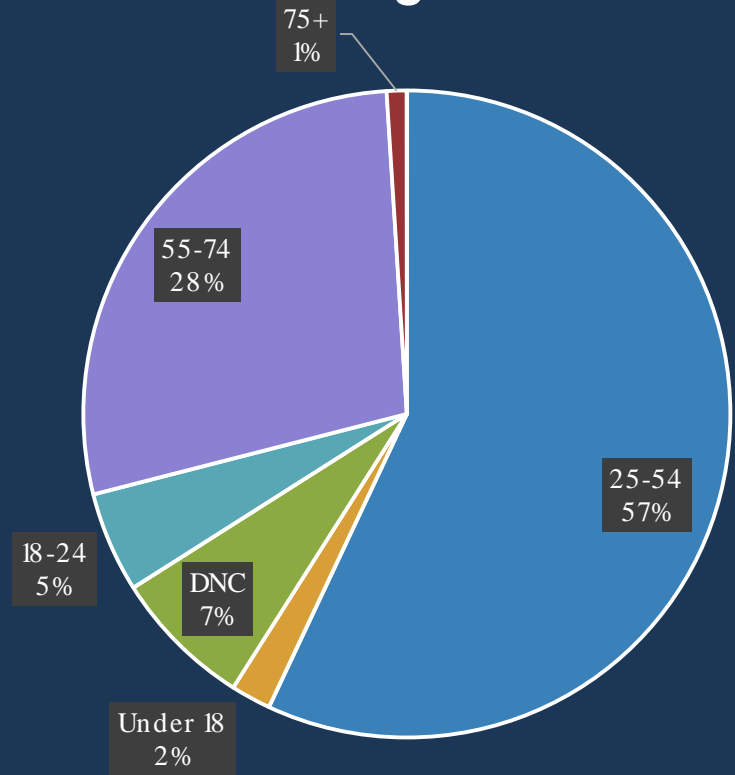

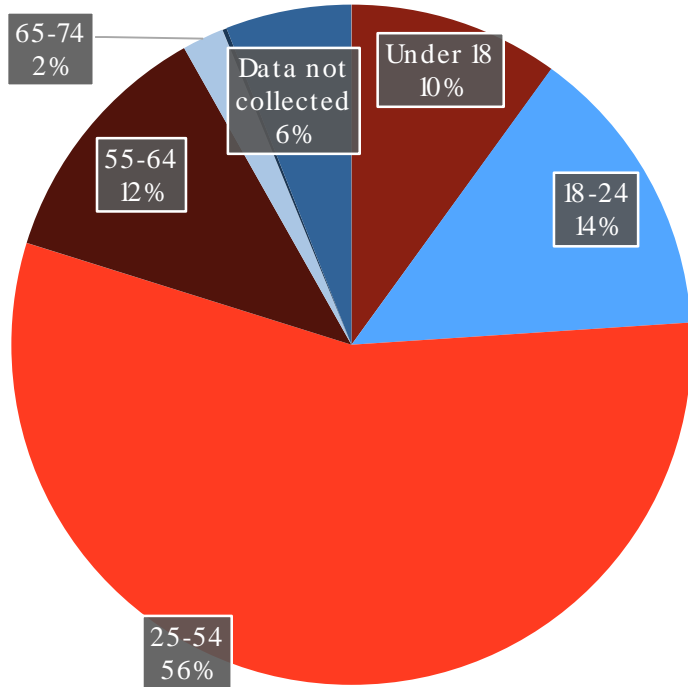

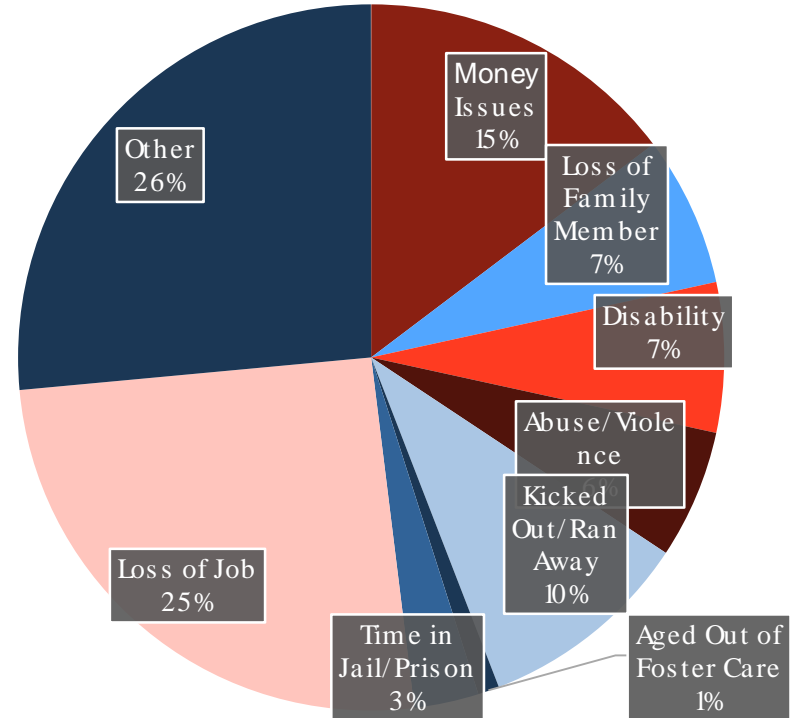
Age

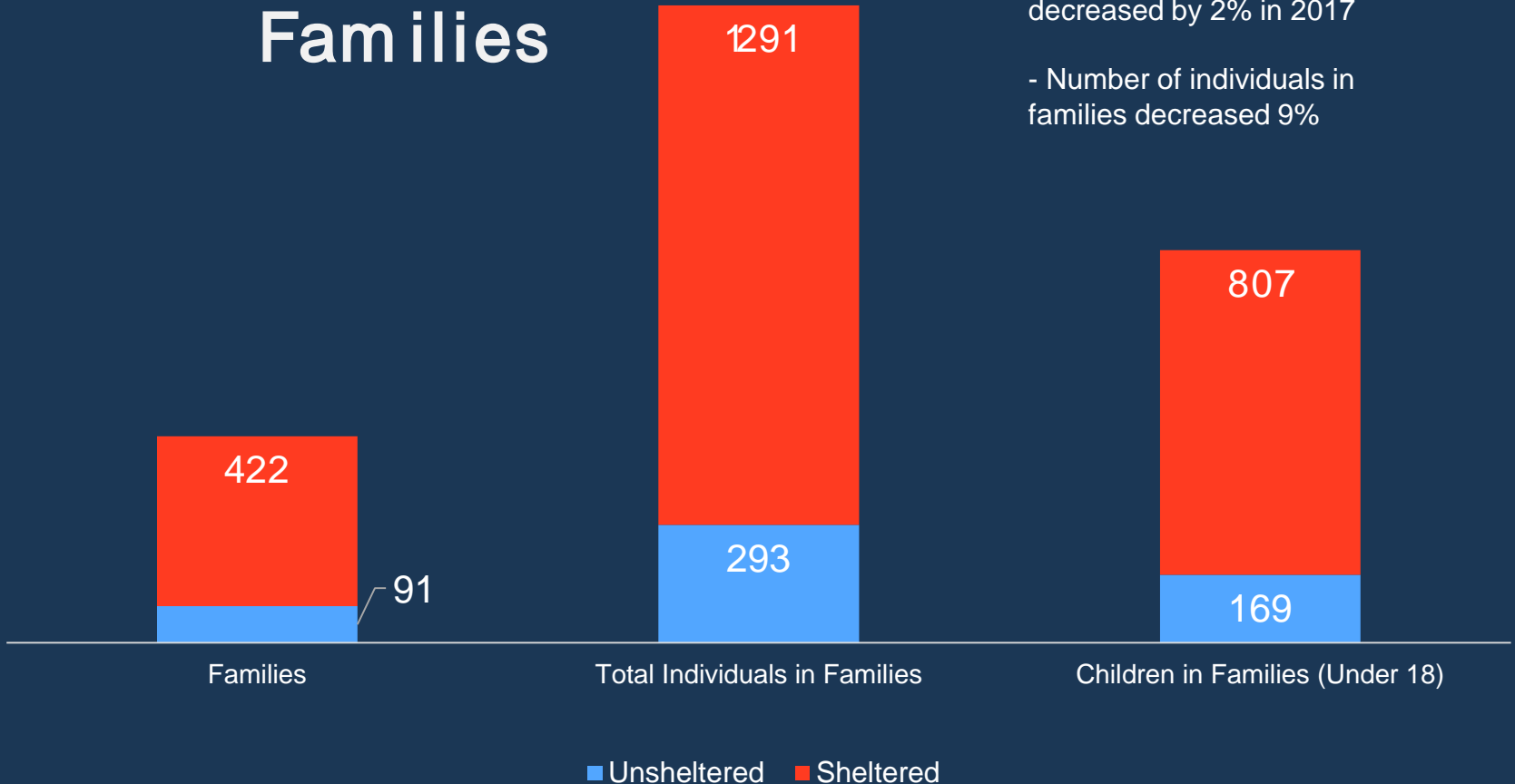

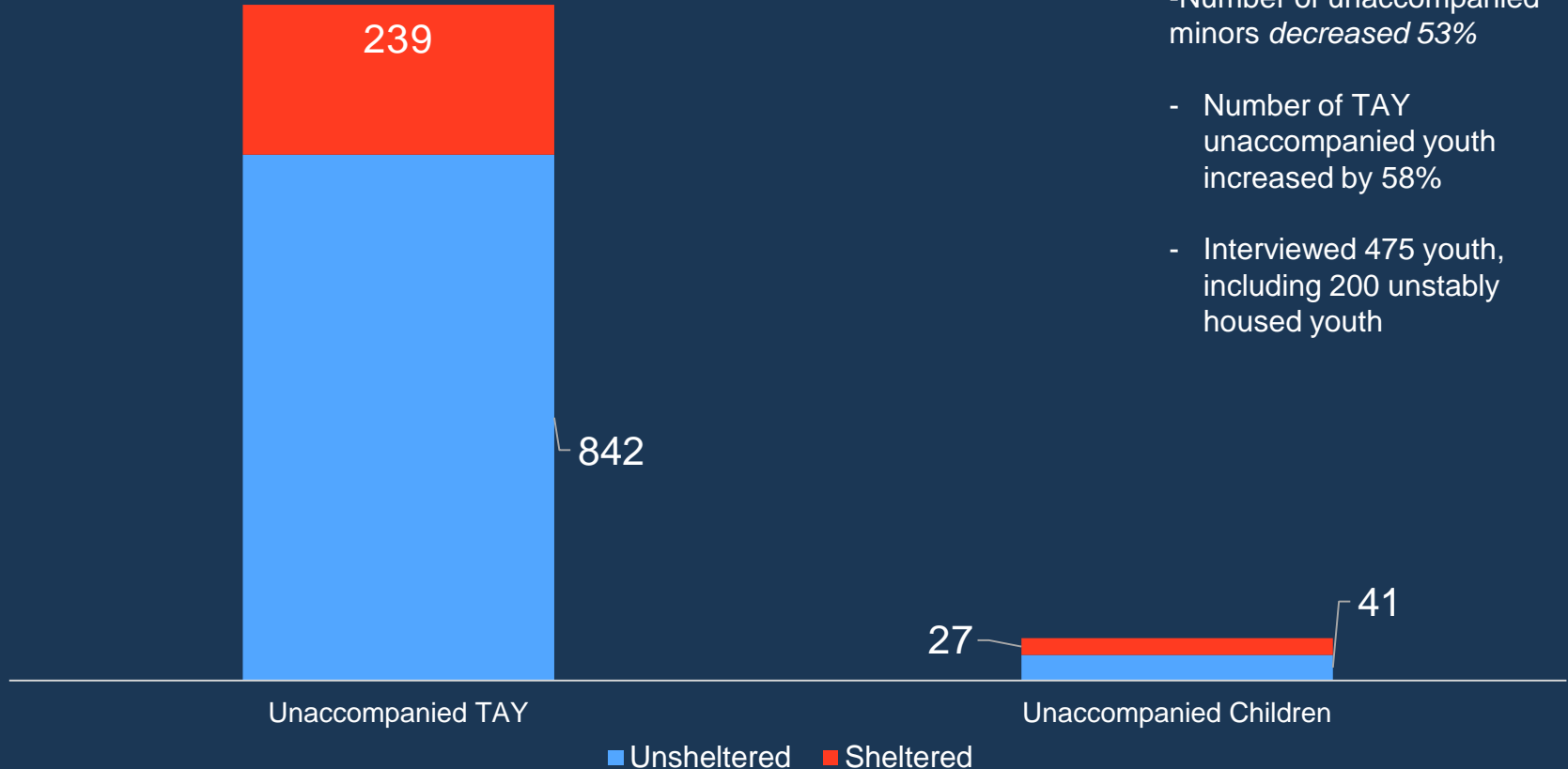
Homelessness + Families

- Number of families decreased by 2% in 2017

- Number of individuals in families decreased 9%



2017 Youth Count



-Number of unaccompanied youth *increased 39%*

-Number of unaccompanied minors *decreased 53%*

- Number of TAY unaccompanied youth increased by 58%

- Interviewed 475 youth, including 200 unstably housed youth

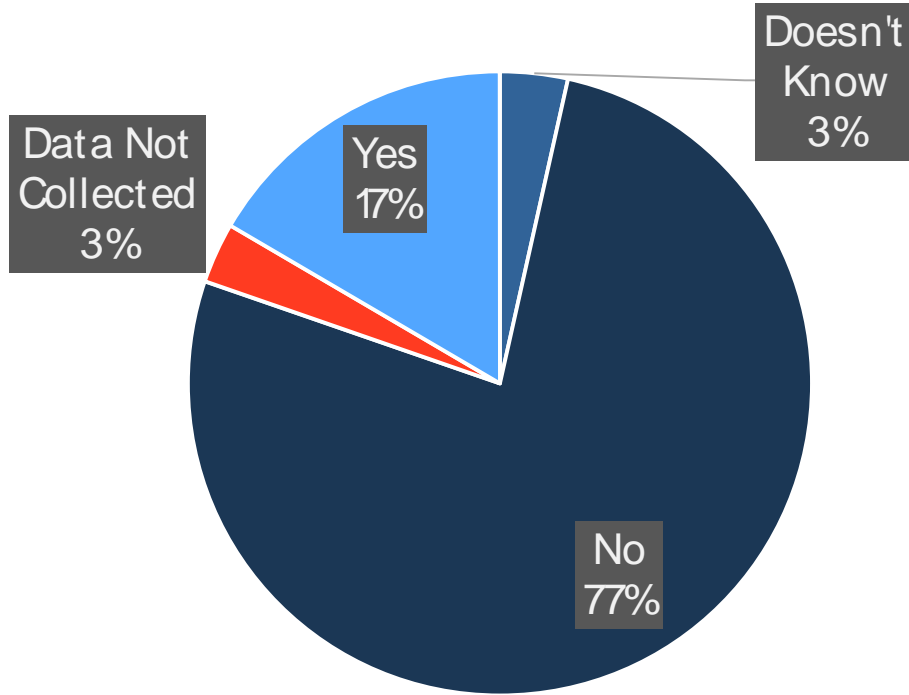

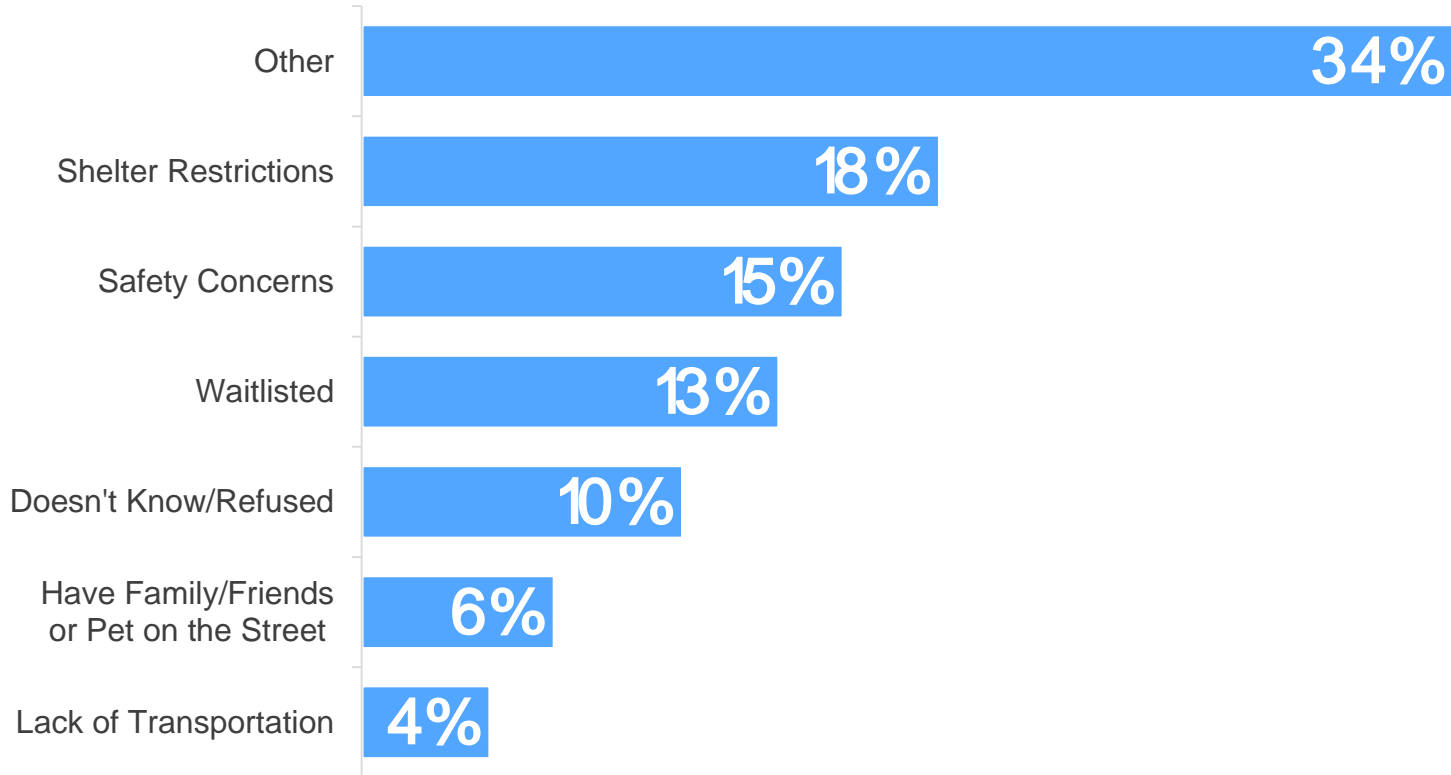

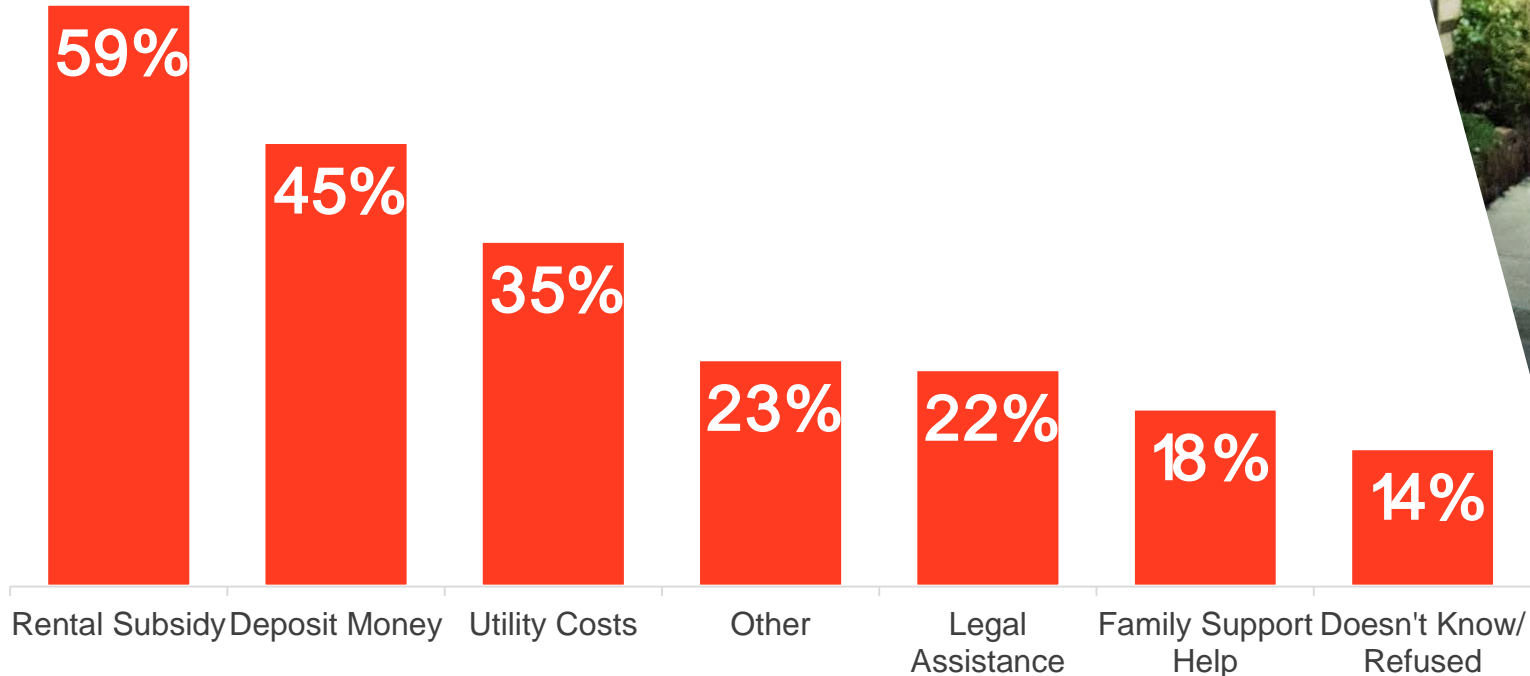
