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Executive Summary

Goal of Report

On January 23rd, 2015, 8,742 individuals were homeless in San Diego County. The goal of this report is to educate the community, elected officials, and community stakeholders on the homeless population, in hopes of improving community awareness, and to provide data for local decisions.



Overview of the Point-In-Time Count

The Point-in-Time (PIT) count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night in January. HUD requires that Continuums of Care conduct an annual count of homeless persons who are sheltered in emergency shelter, transitional housing, and Safe Havens on a single night. Continuums of Care also must conduct a count of unsheltered homeless persons every other year. 2015 was a mandated year for communities to conduct an unsheltered count.

8,742 homeless persons were counted in San Diego County in January, 2015.



In San Diego, the count occurred on January 23rd from 4 a.m. to 7 a.m. and included 1,488 volunteers. Volunteers covered over 4,000 square miles and counted 4,156 homeless individuals sleeping on the street, in hand built structures, or in automobiles.

On the day of the count, data was collected from homeless service providers to determine how many people spent the night in emergency shelters, transitional houses, and Safe Havens. A total of 4,586 individuals spent the night in homeless shelters or programs.

Results

A total of 4,156 unsheltered homeless were counted; 66.5% of the unsheltered homeless were enumerated in the City of San Diego. There was a 4.3% increase in the number of unsheltered homeless between 2014 and 2015.

Veterans made up 15% of the unsheltered homeless population in San Diego County

In addition to the unsheltered homeless, there were 4,586 homeless persons that spent the night in a emergency shelter, transitional housing, or a Safe Haven program. The number of homeless persons staying in the shelter system rose by 1.4% from the previous year.

Characteristics

The majority of the unsheltered population reported living in San Diego County year round and had been homeless for over a year. Loss of a job was reported as the leading cause of homelessness.

Demographics

It is estimated that 70% of unsheltered homeless are male and that 64% are white. The average age was 36.

Veterans made up 15% of the unsheltered homeless population, which equates to 631 unsheltered veterans. The total number of unsheltered veterans increased by 22% from 2014 to 2015. Despite this increase, the number of unsheltered veterans decreased by 29% over the last five years.

It is estimated that:

- Roughly one-third of the unsheltered homeless have a physical disability
- Two-thirds reported having health insurance
- One in seven of the homeless are on probation or parole
- One-fifth reported a severe mental illness
- 17% reported substance or alcohol abuse disabilities; 9% reported substance abuse disabilities;
- Roughly two out of three had spent time in jail or prison.

Roughly one half of the homeless in San Diego County are Unsheltered



Methodology

The methodology of the PITC has three parts,

- 1) The unsheltered count
- 2) The sheltered count
- 3) The unsheltered interview/survey.

Unsheltered Count

Groups of two or more are assigned a census tract. Each group is then given a map of the assigned census tract. Groups mark the location on the map of where homeless persons are seen, either on the street, in a vehicle, tent or hand built structure.

Sheltered Count

The sheltered homeless count was verified through the utilization of the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) database, which is used by over 50 organizations that serve the homeless in the region. The unsheltered homeless count occurs on the same day as the unsheltered count in order to ensure that no one is counted twice.

Unsheltered Interview/Survey

In addition to physically counting the number of unsheltered homeless, volunteers interviewed approximately 23% of the estimated unsheltered homeless population. Specific efforts were made to survey a sample that was representative of all unsheltered homeless in each city and the unincorporated area of the county. This was achieved by surveying more heavily in areas with higher rates of unsheltered homeless, and surveying less heavily in areas with

23% of the unsheltered homeless population were surveyed.

Definitions of homeless

According to HUD, a person is considered homeless only when he/she resides in one of the places described below at the time of the count.

An **unsheltered homeless** person resides in: A place not meant for human habitation, such as cars, parks, sidewalks, abandoned buildings, or on the street.

A **sheltered homeless** person resides in: An emergency shelter, including temporary emergency shelters only open during severe weather. Transitional housing for homeless persons who originally came from the streets or emergency shelters.

lower rates of unsheltered homelessness. This method of surveying allows the Regional Task Force on the Homeless (RTFH) to estimate the characteristics of the entire unsheltered population in San Diego County and make estimates on the numbers of individuals with certain characteristics.

Point-In-Time Count Myths

The Alliance's Homeless Research Institute has put together a media resource, "5 Myths about PIT Counts" to help communities better understand the PITC.

Myth 1: PITCs are inaccurate because they do not count every homeless person.

PIT counts are a solid count of people experiencing homelessness in shelters, transitional housing, and on the street, in cars, in abandoned buildings, and in other places not intended for human habitation

Myth 2: Other national statistics contradict PITC data.

There are several national data sources on homelessness, but they do not cover the same population over the same time period, and subsequently cannot be directly compared to the PIT count

Myth 3: PITCs are meant to provide data on everyone who is homeless.

PIT counts are intended to provide a snapshot of how many people are homeless on a given night.

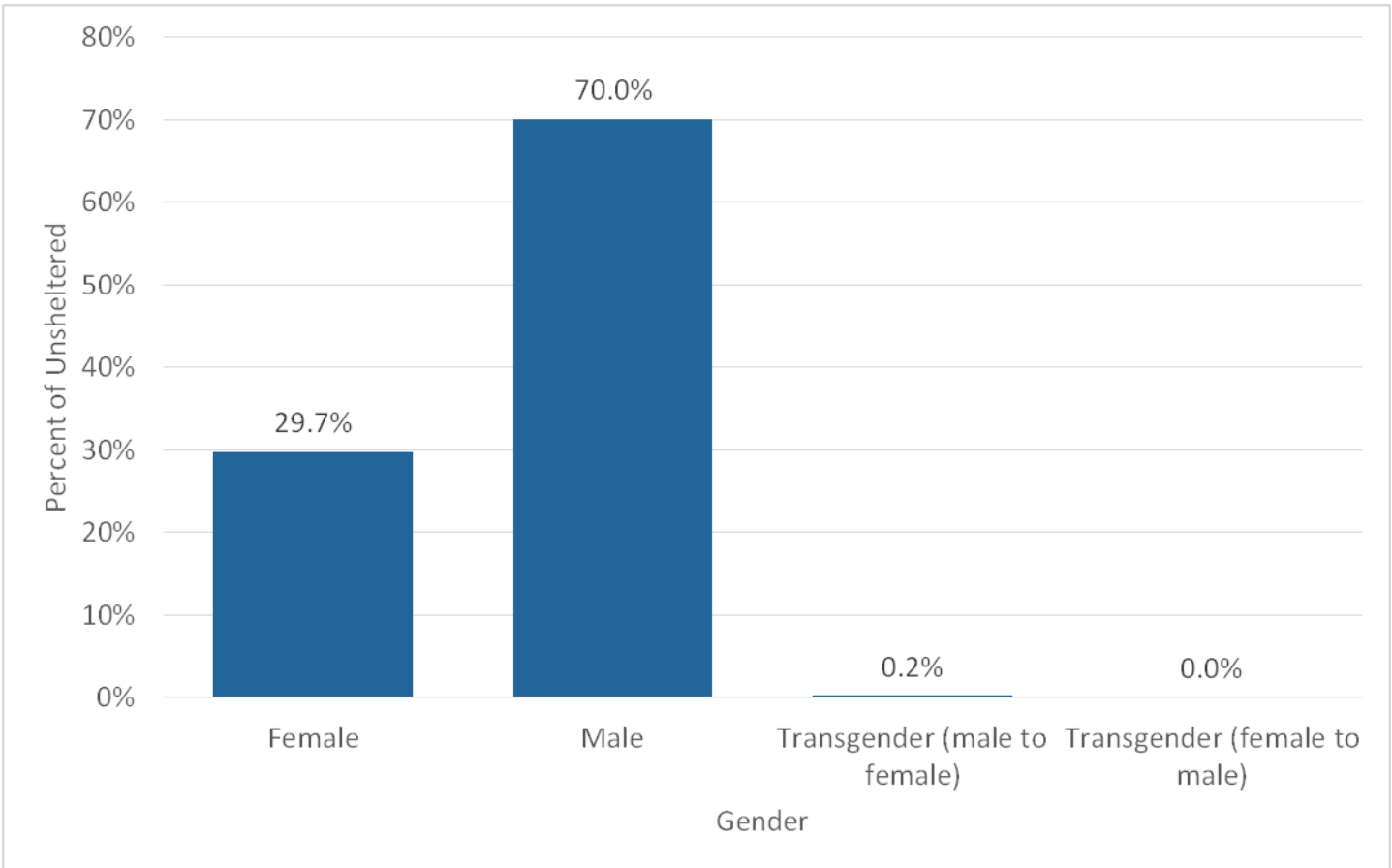
Myth 4: Fluctuations in the PITC reflect fluctuations in the number of shelter beds, not in the number of homeless people.

The PIT counts reflect the interaction among people in beds, people unsheltered, and utilization of beds.

Myth 5: If the count is down, it means that there is enough affordable housing in the community.

The PIT describes how the homeless system is managing people's experience of the shortage of affordable housing – not the availability of that housing.

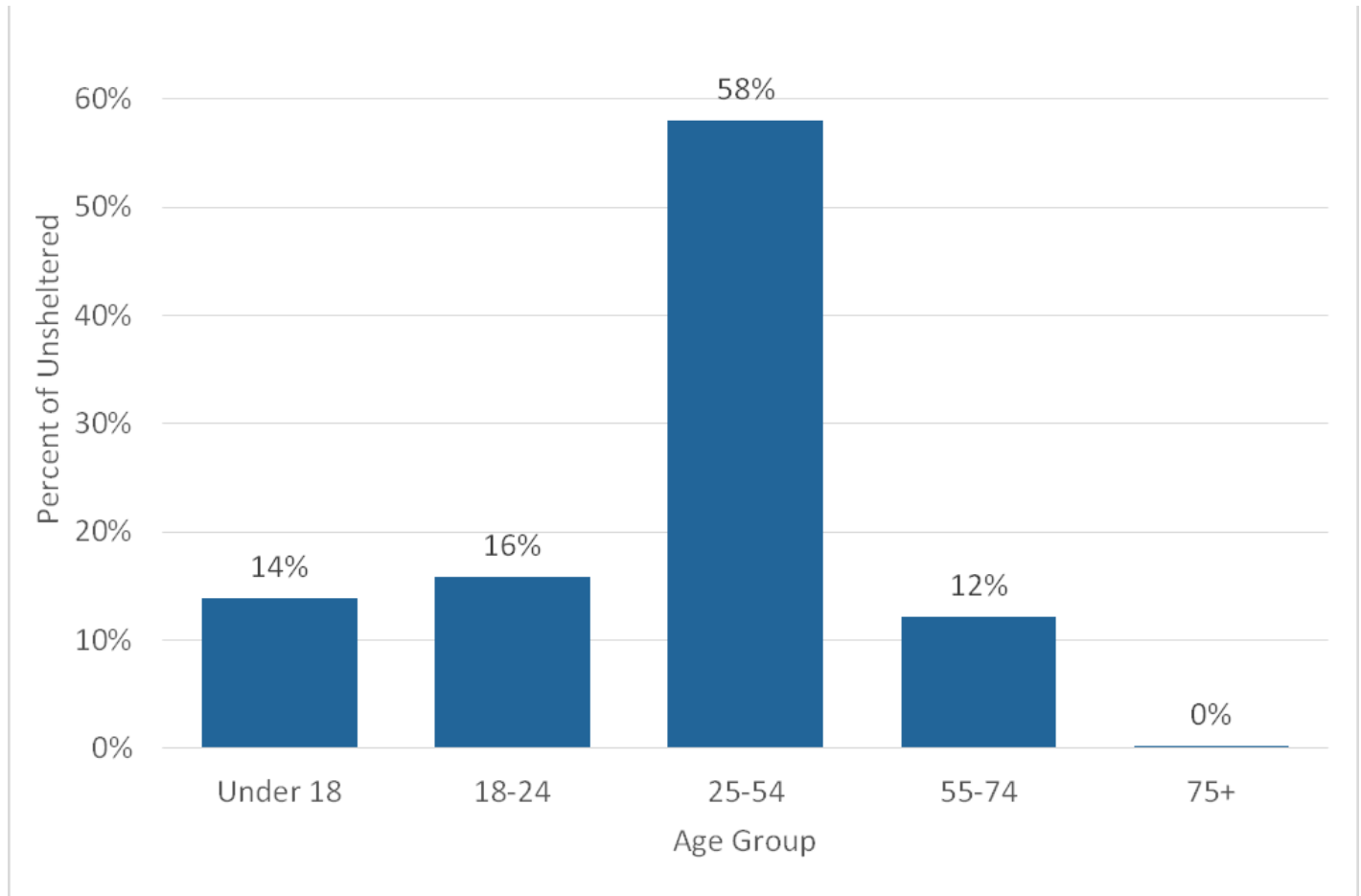
Gender of Unsheltered Homeless

Age of Unsheltered Homeless

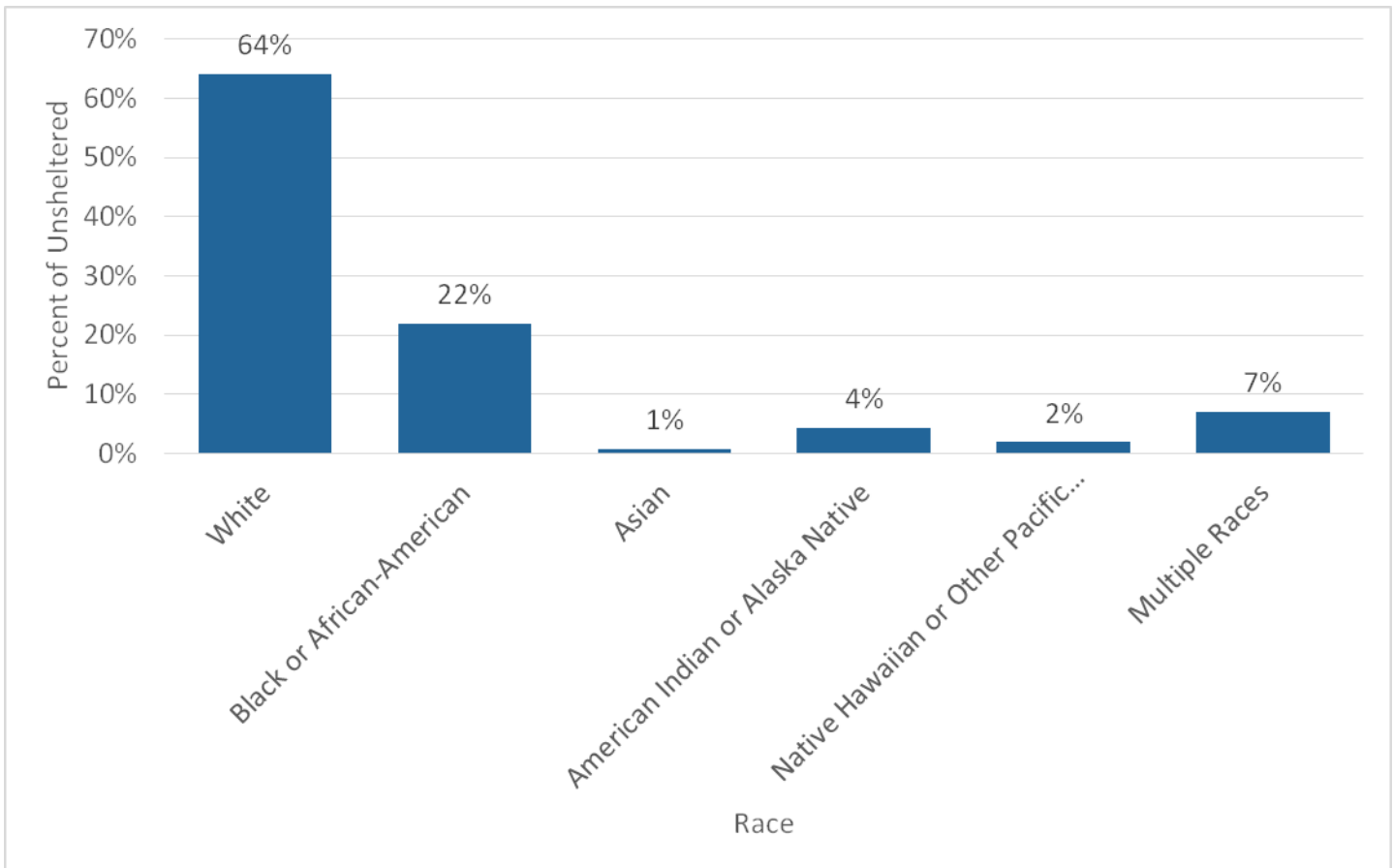


The majority of the unsheltered homeless are between 25 years old and 55 years old. 3% were under 18 years old.

Age groups were created to represent stages of life. There were five age groups, representing minors (<18 years old), transitional age youth (18-24 years old), adults (25-54 years old), older adults (55-74 years old), and the elderly (75+ years old).

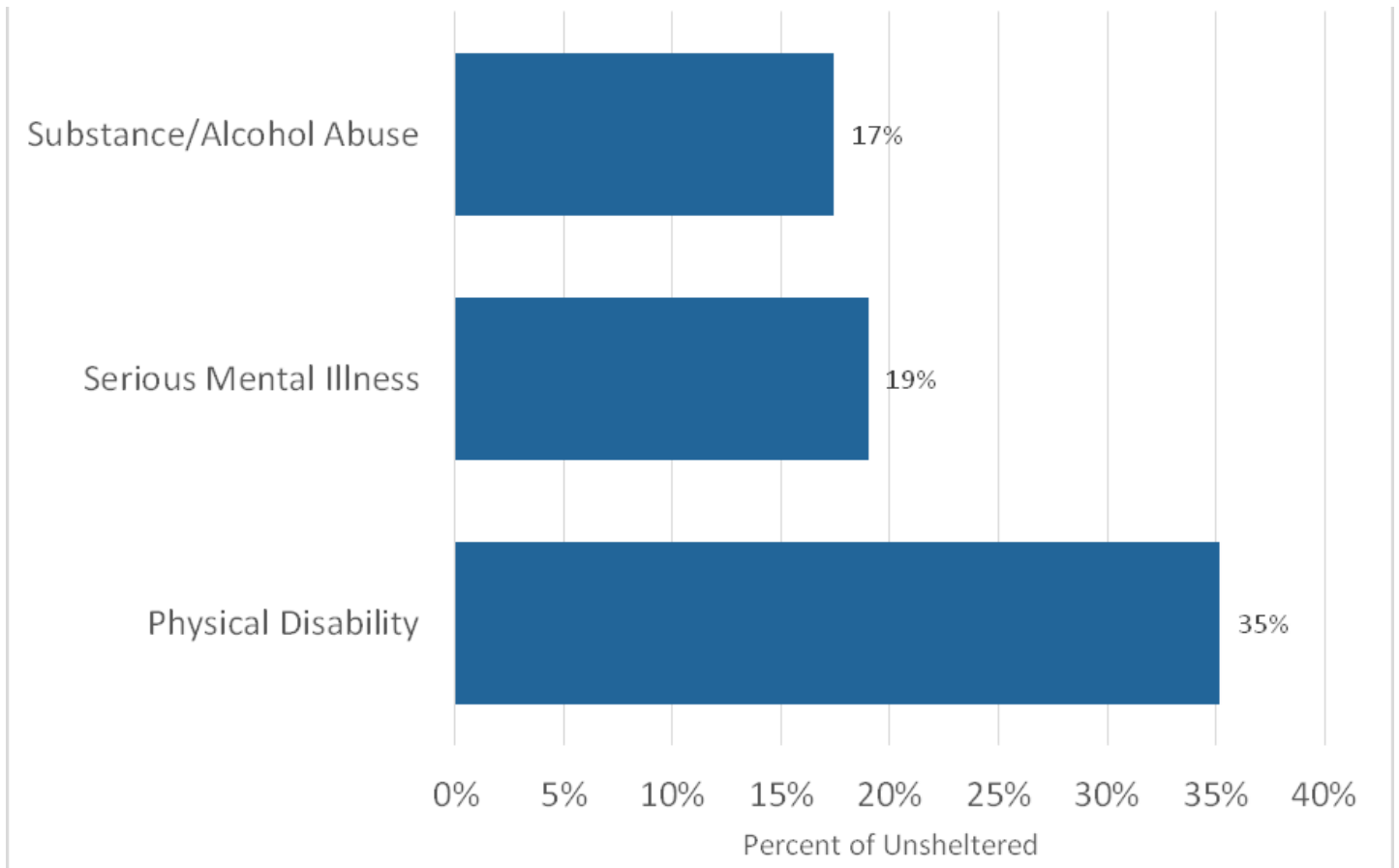
Race of Unsheltered Homeless

Prevalence of Disabilities Among Unsheltered Homeless

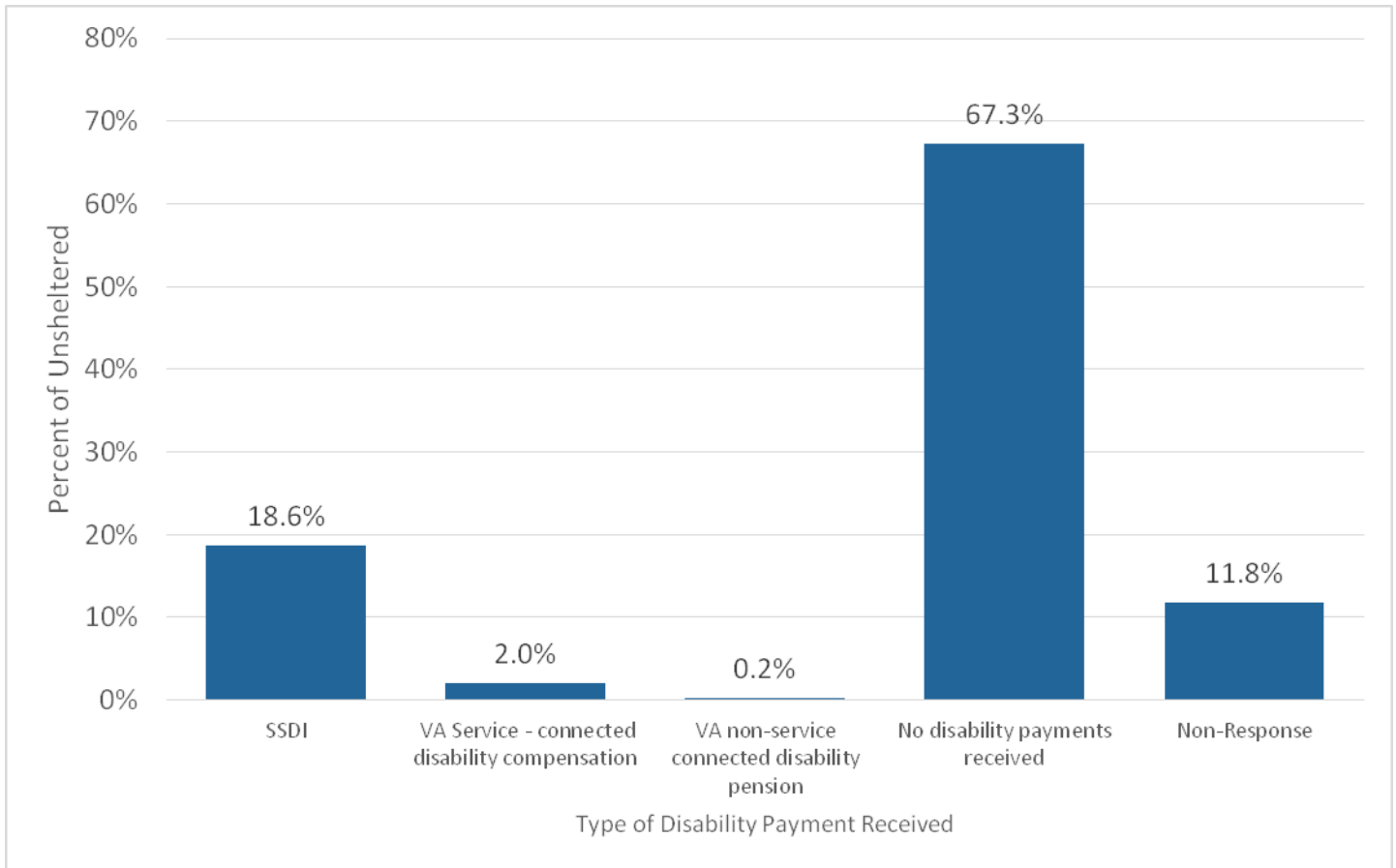


Physical disability is the most common form of disability, affecting 35% of unsheltered homeless.

All disabilities are based on self report and do not require documentation. “Serious mental illness” is defined as a mental illness that is severe, long term, and inhibits an abilities to live independently.

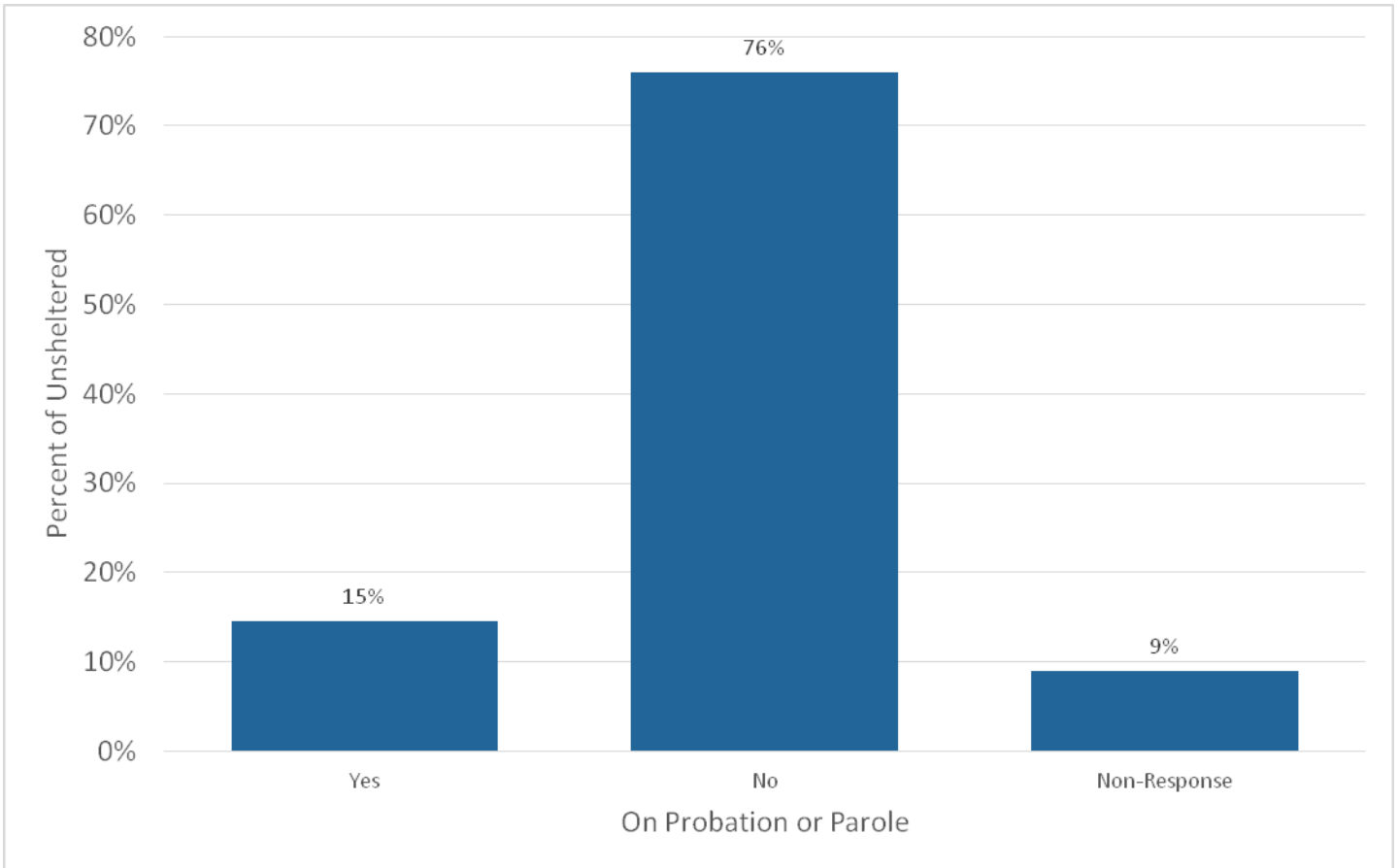
Disability Payments Among Unsheltered Homeless



A large portion of the homeless are dependent on disability payments. Although 23% receive disability payments, the payments alone are not enough to get them off the streets. Although 16% of the homeless population are veterans, less than 2.5% receive disability payments through the VA.

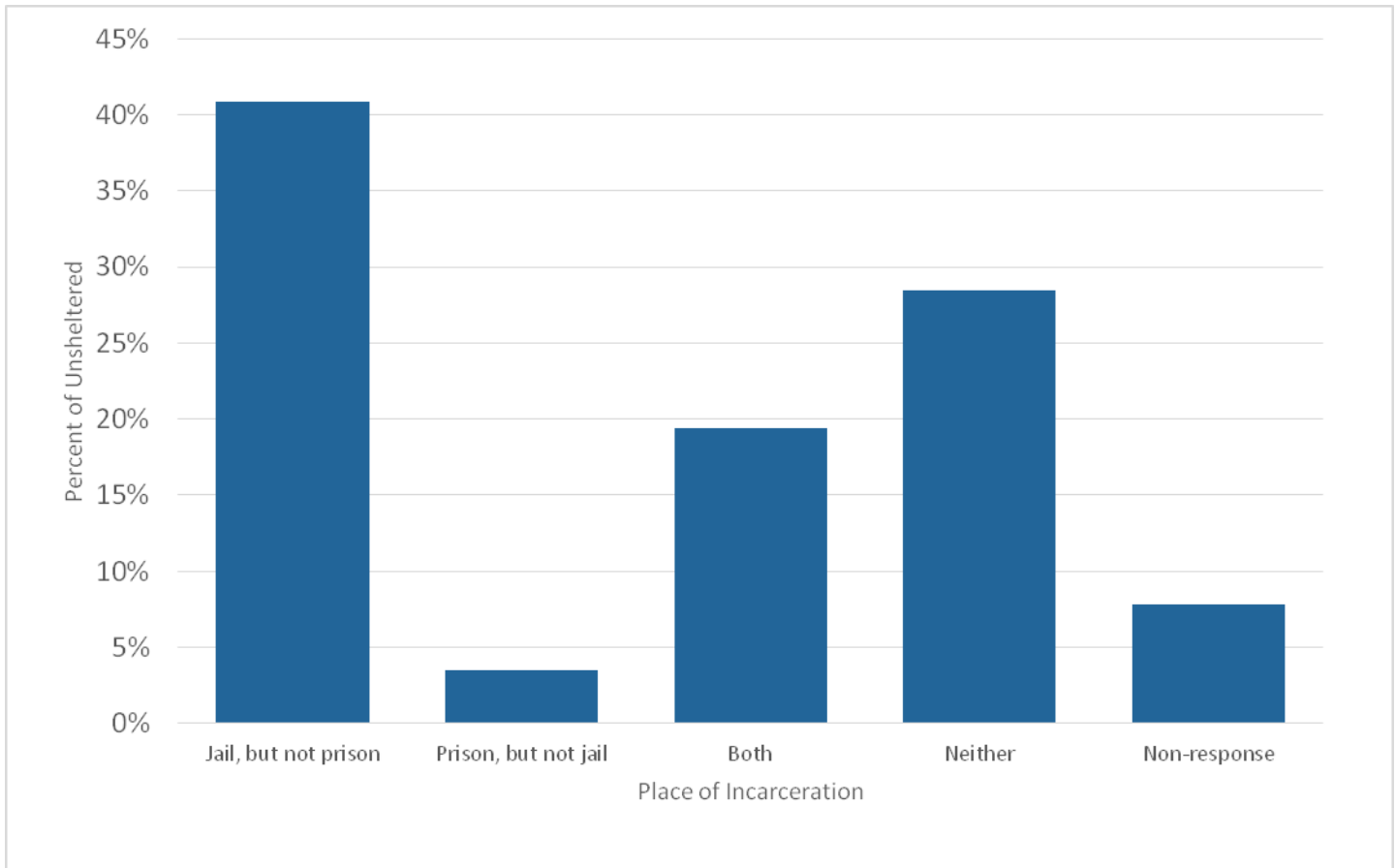
Probation or Parole Among Unsheltered Homeless

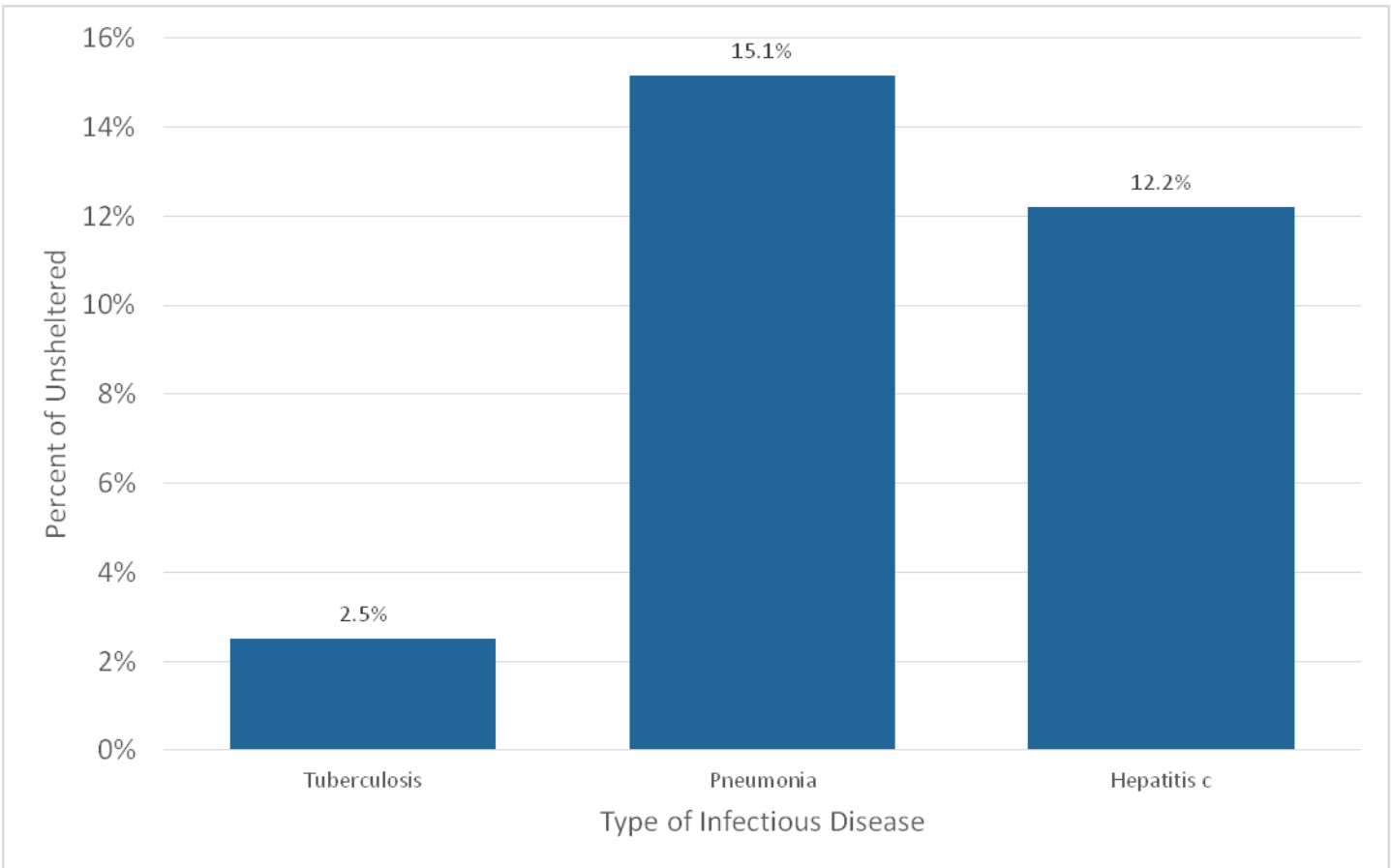
Jail and/or Prison Among Unsheltered Homeless

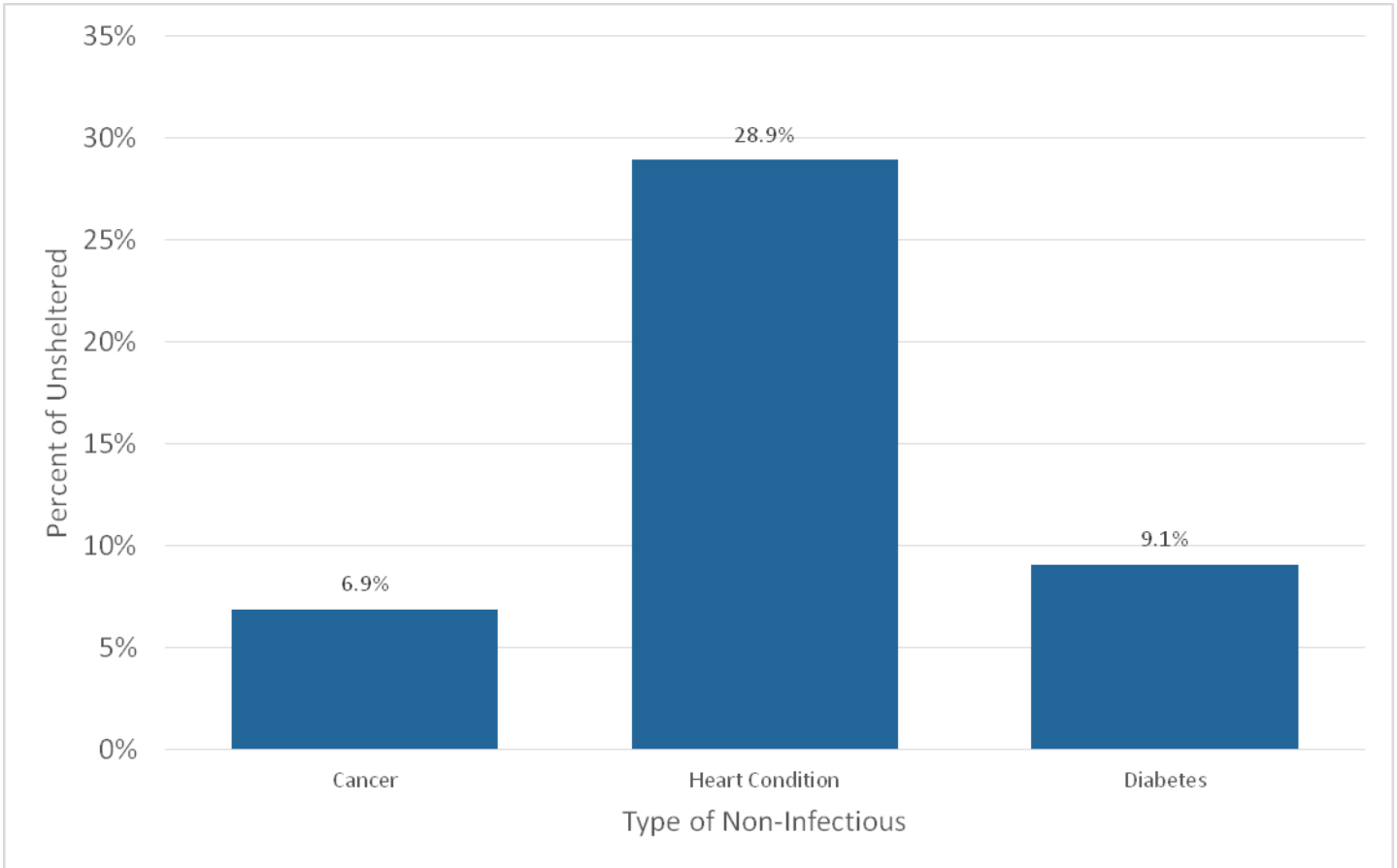
Infectious Disease Among Unsheltered Homeless Adults



The rates of infectious diseases are much higher among those who are unsheltered and homeless compared to the general population. Tuberculosis, Pneumonia, and Hepatitis C are three of the most common and potentially dangerous disease for unsheltered homeless. It is estimated that 15% of unsheltered adults reported having had Pneumonia.

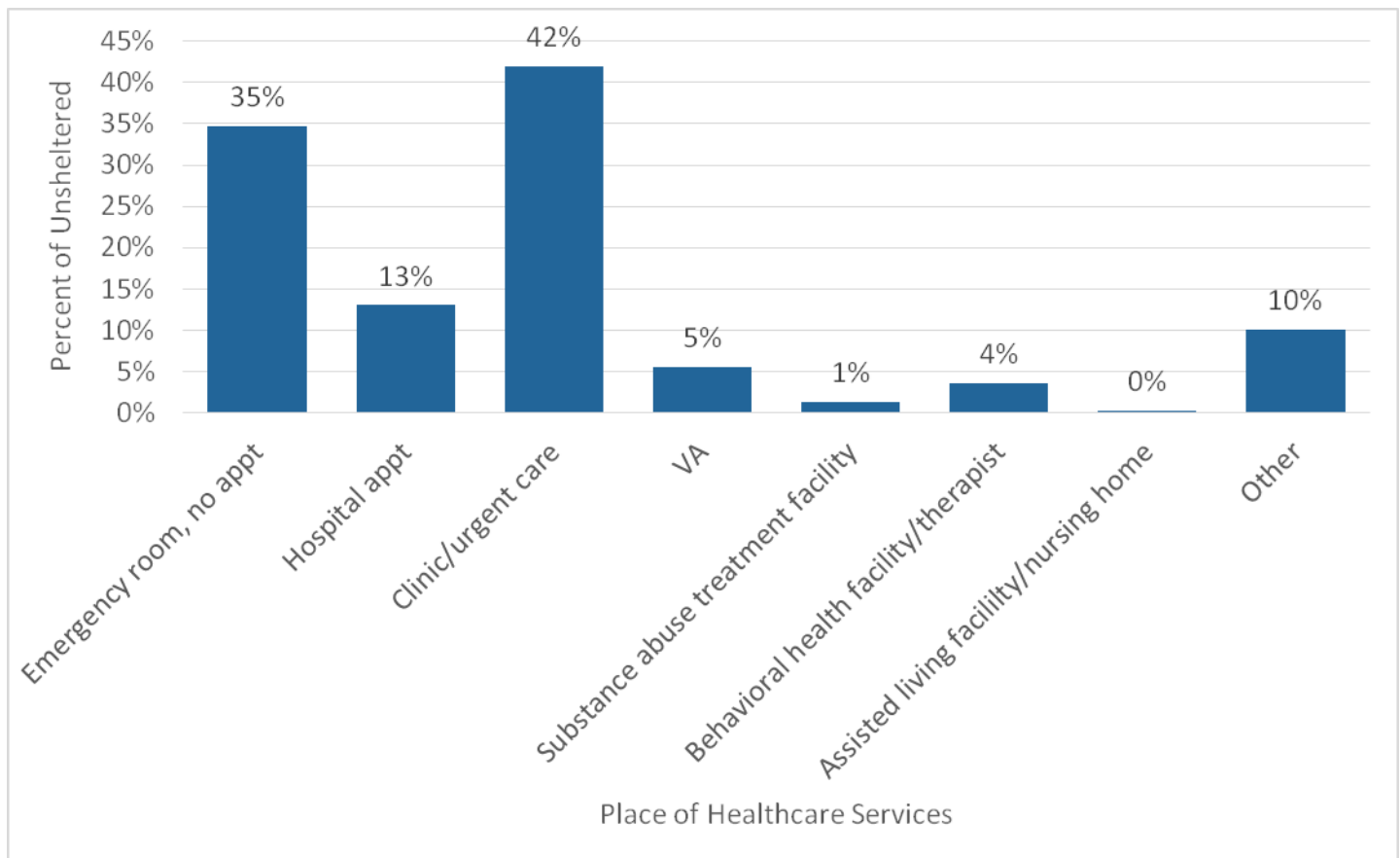
Non-Infectious Disease Among Unsheltered Homeless Adults



Along with infectious disease, non-infectious diseases are more common among the unsheltered homeless than the general population. Chronic diseases present distinct challenges to the unsheltered homeless because of the high costs associated with healthcare and medication. It is estimated that 19% of unsheltered diabetics use insulin.

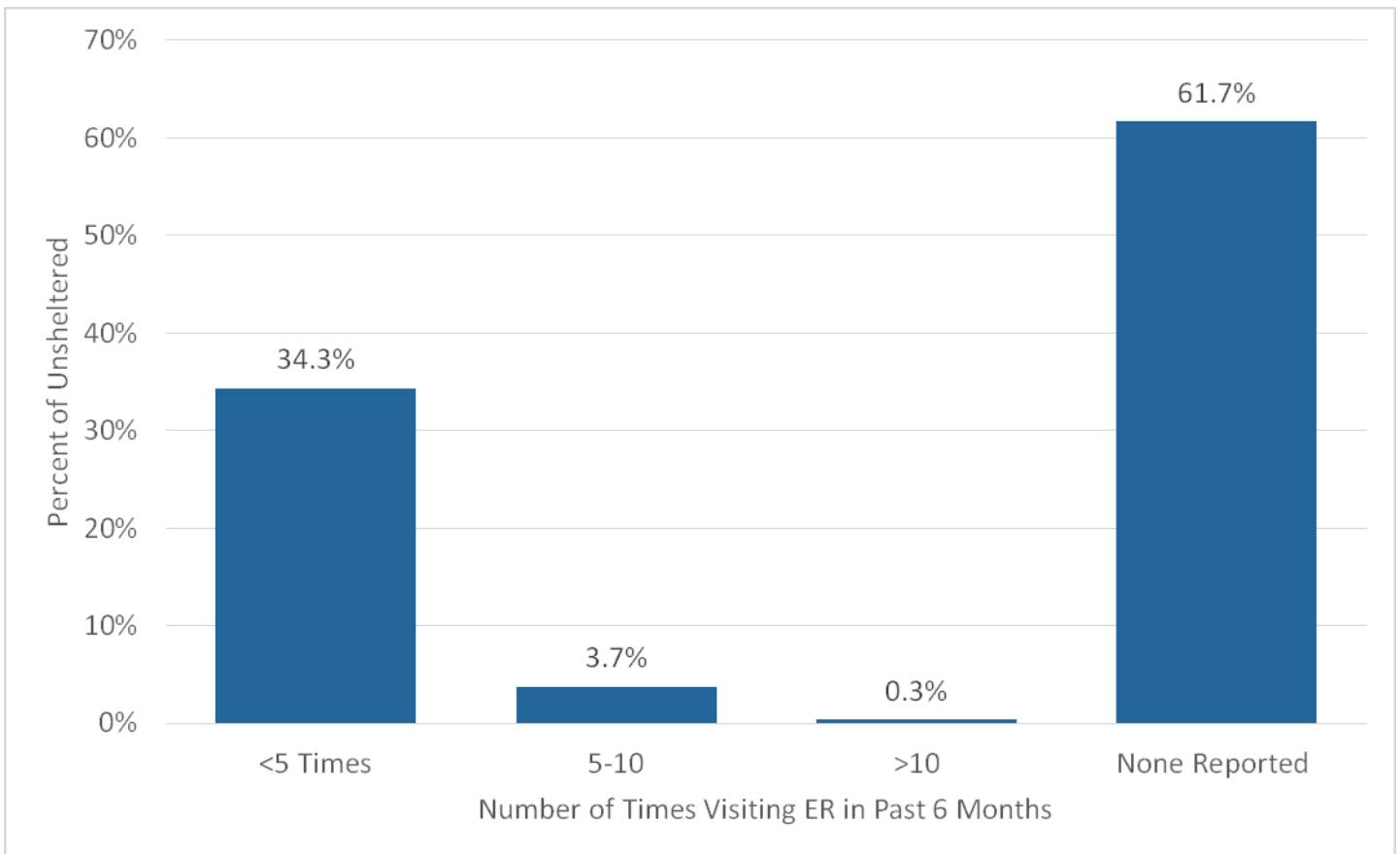
Place of Healthcare Service Among Unsheltered Homeless

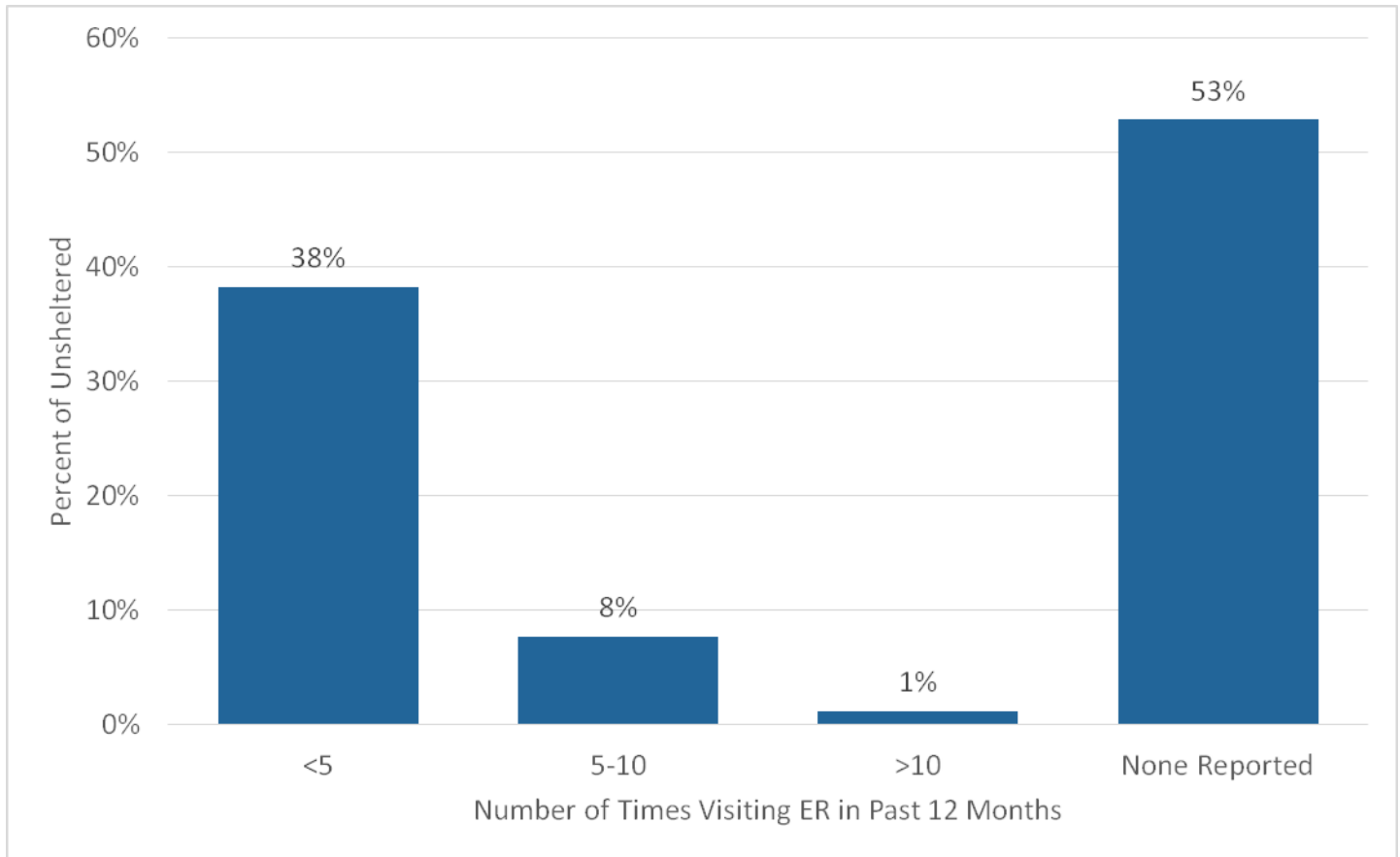
Emergency Room Visits During The Last 6 Months

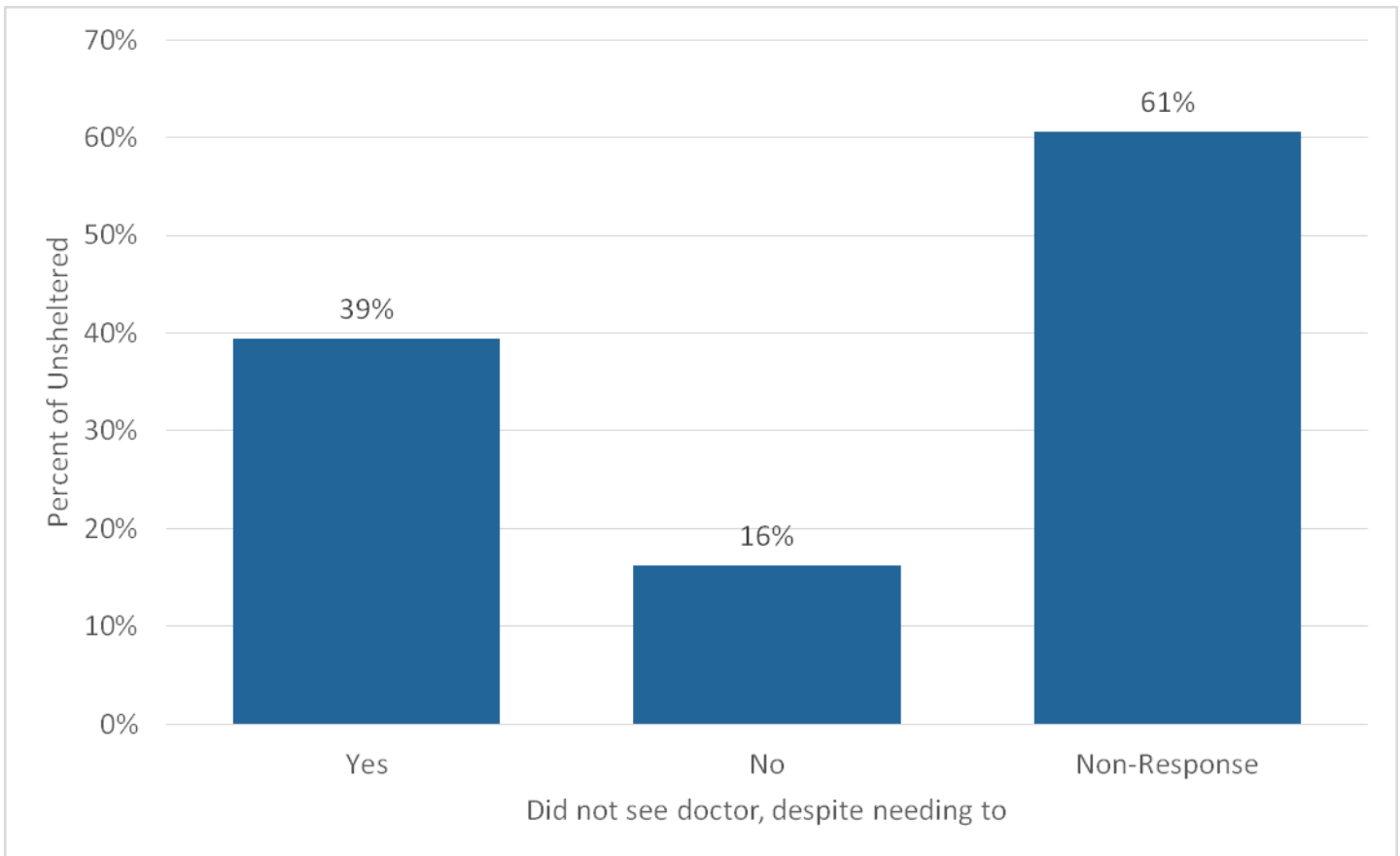
Emergency Room Visits During The Last 12 Months

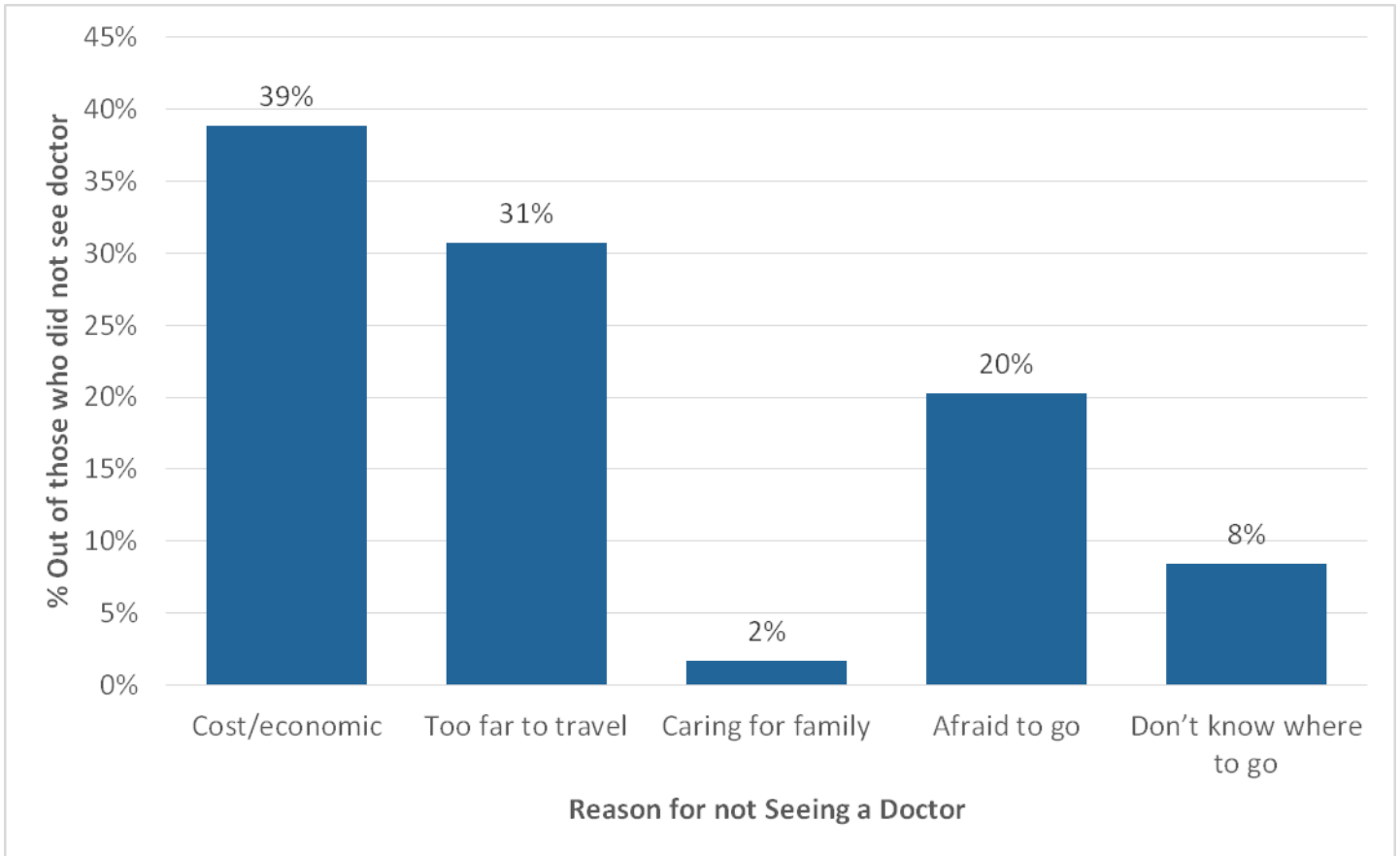
Did Not See a Doctor, Despite Needing To

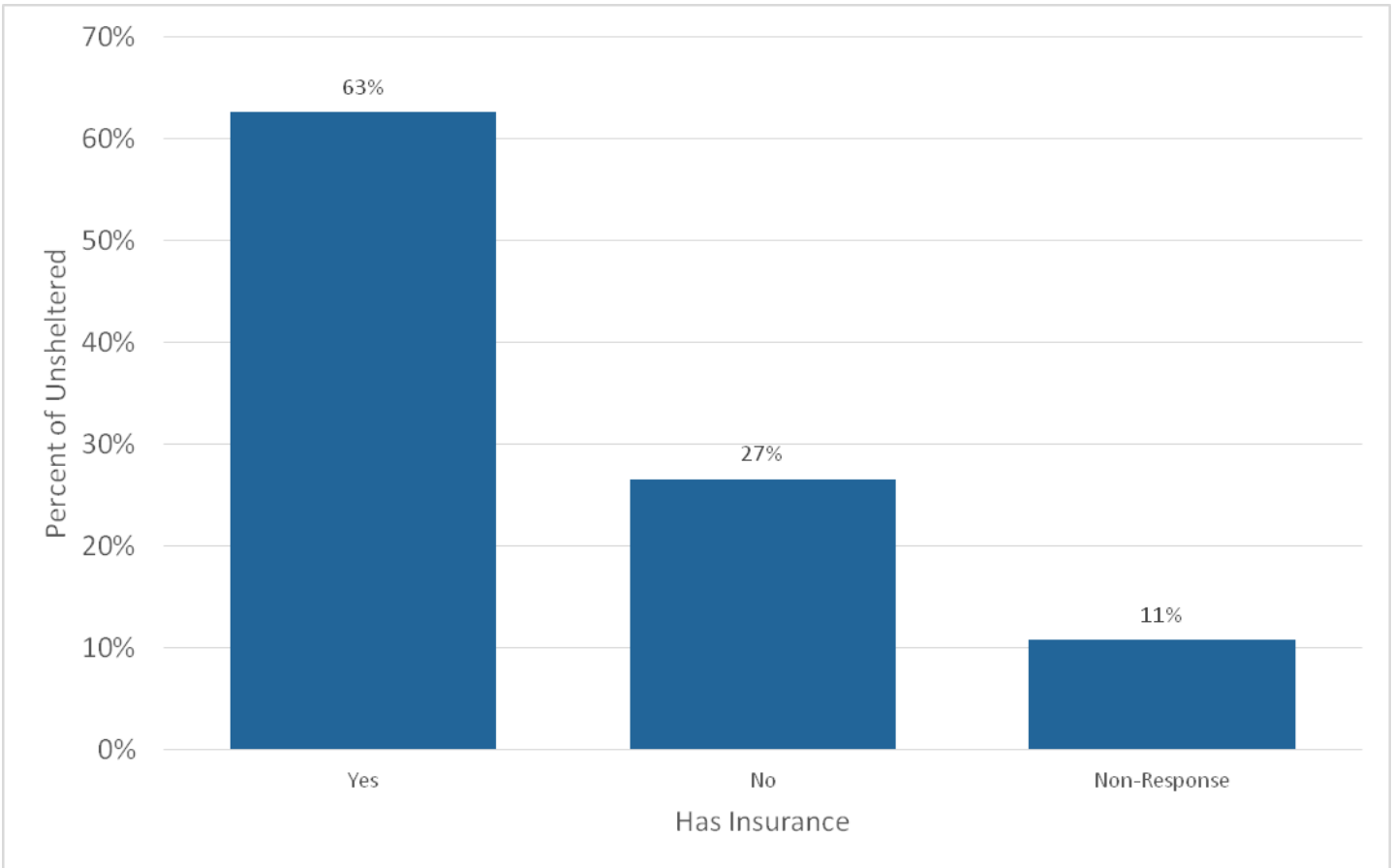

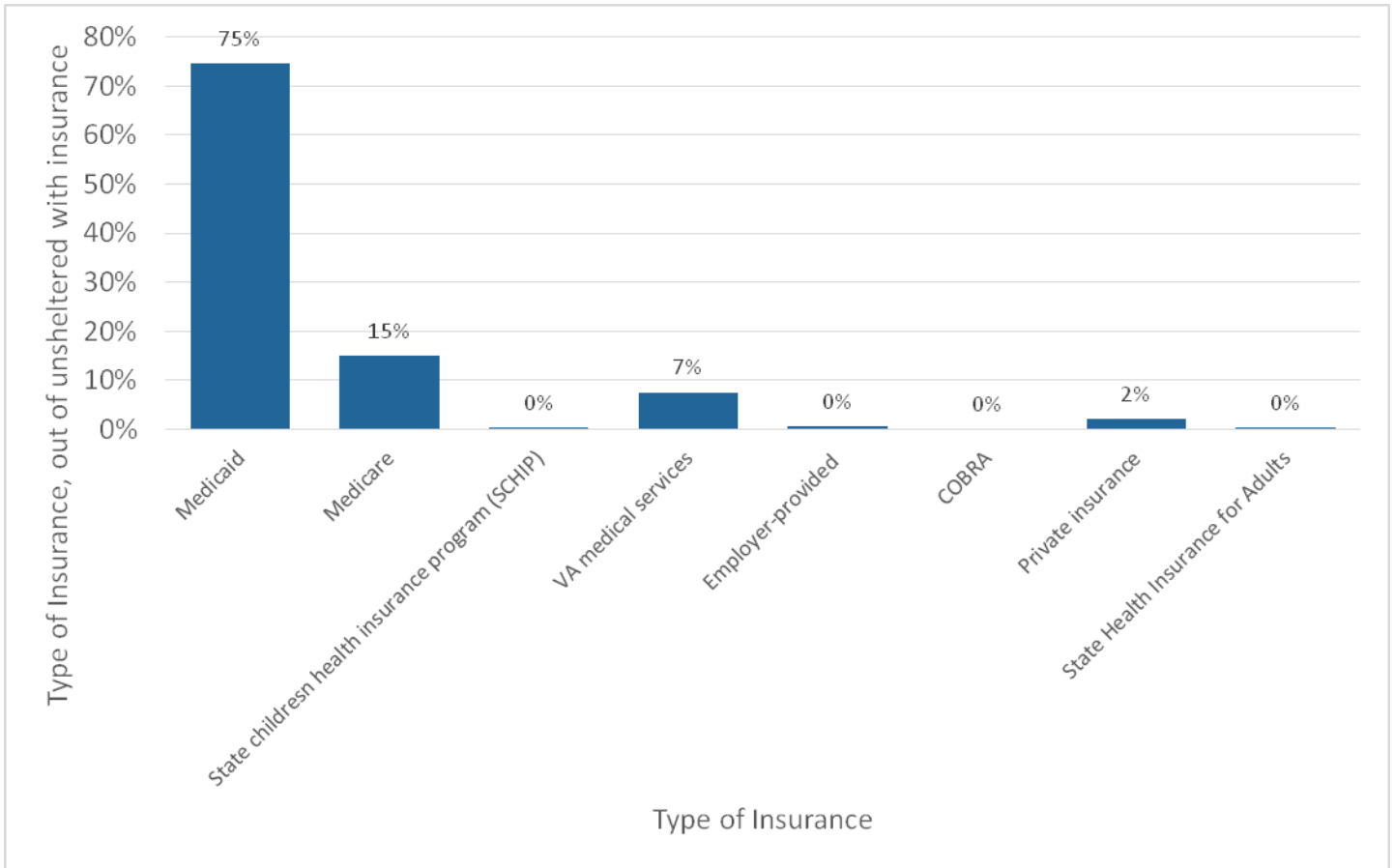

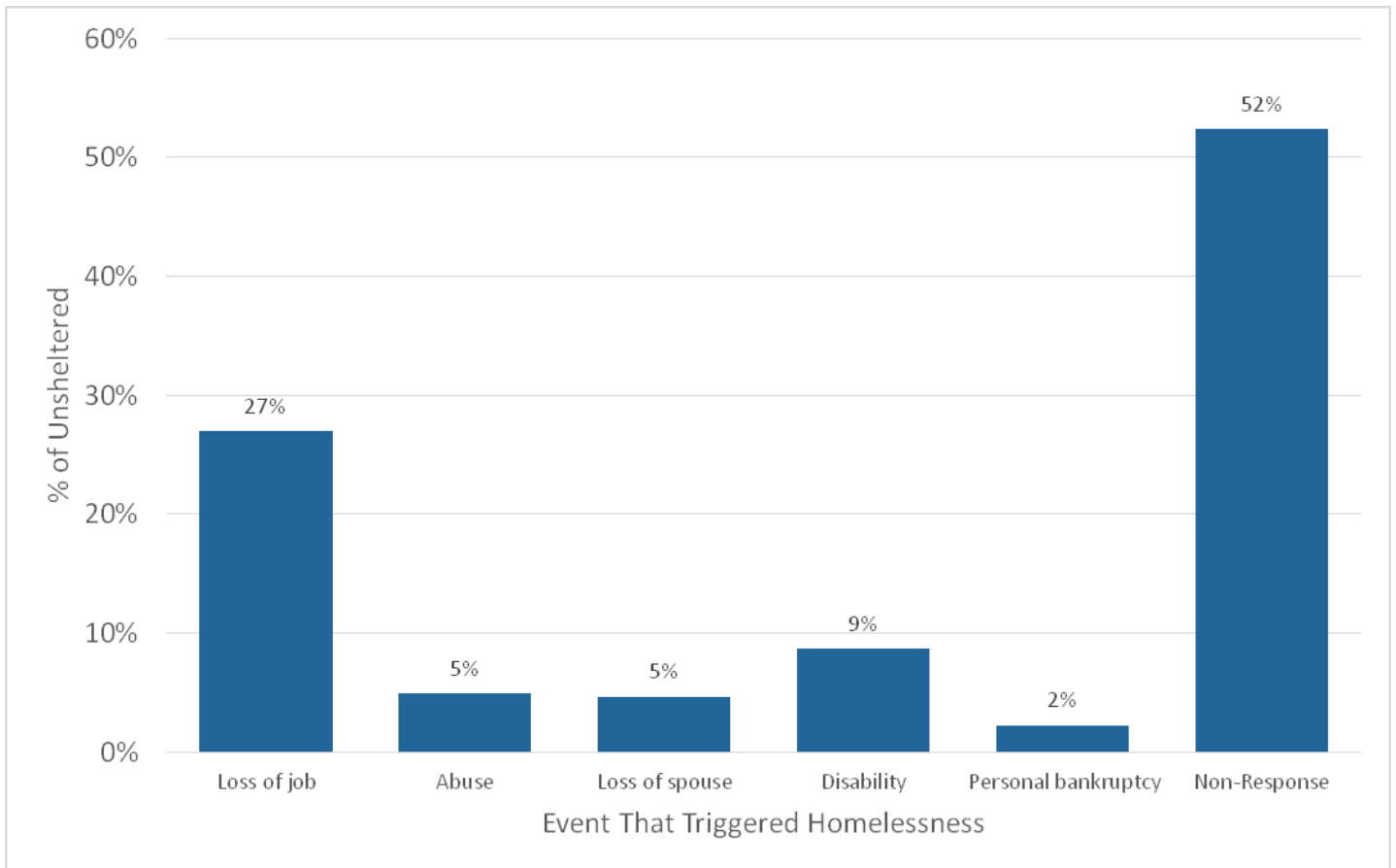
Type of Healthcare Insurance

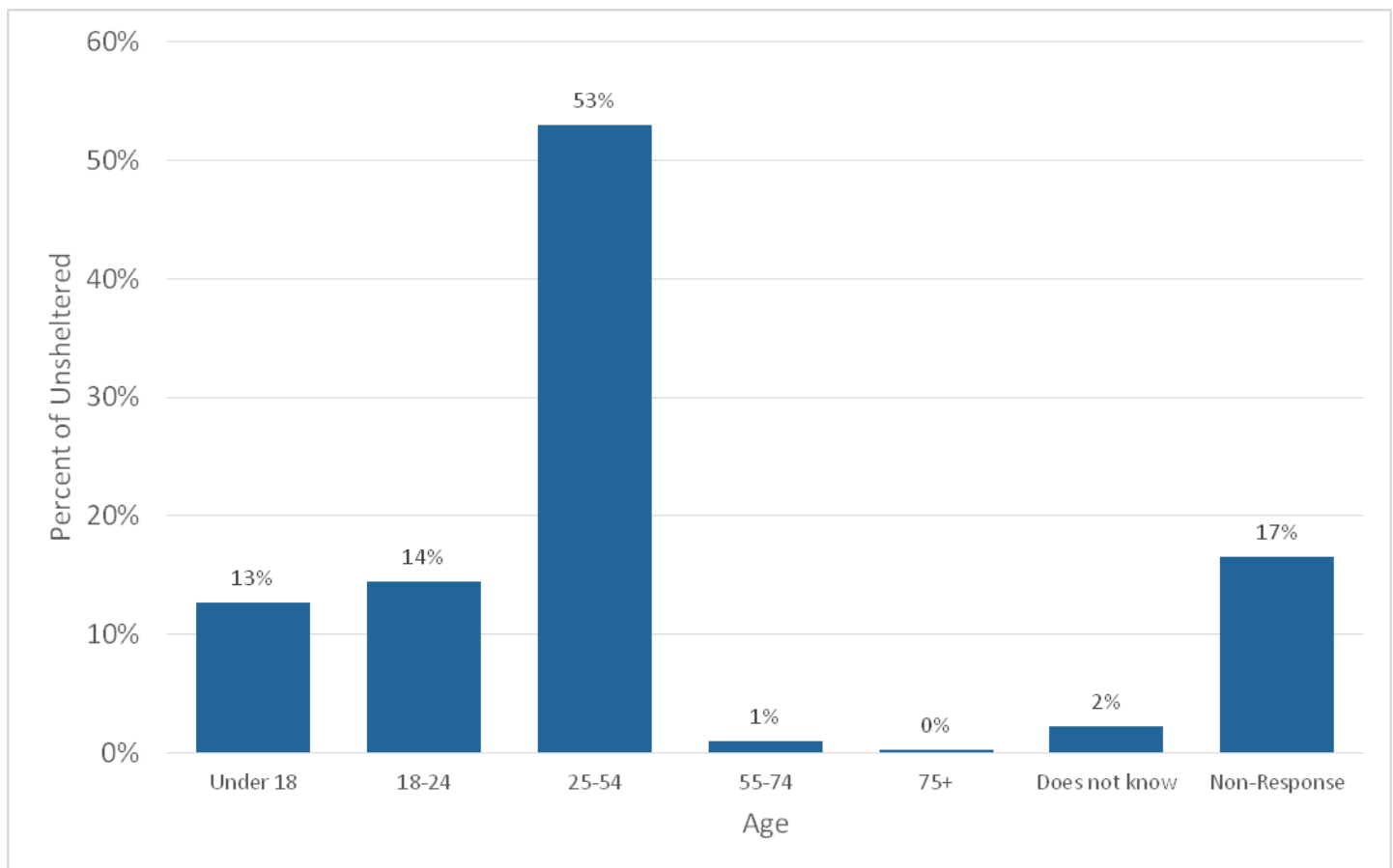
Event That Triggered Homelessness

Age of First Homelessness

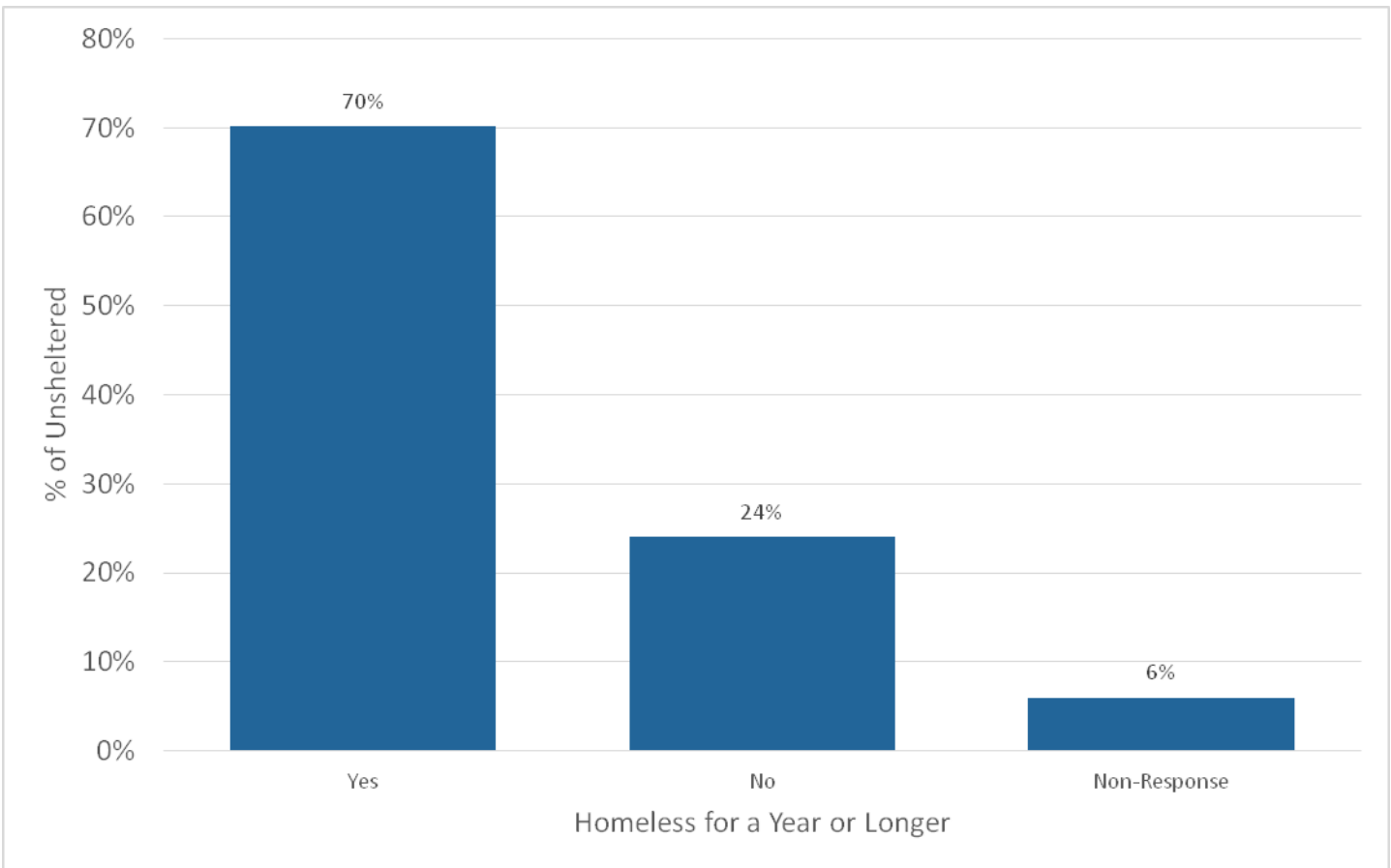


It is estimated that the majority of the unsheltered became homeless when they were between ages of 25-54 years old (53%). 13% became homeless before turning 18.

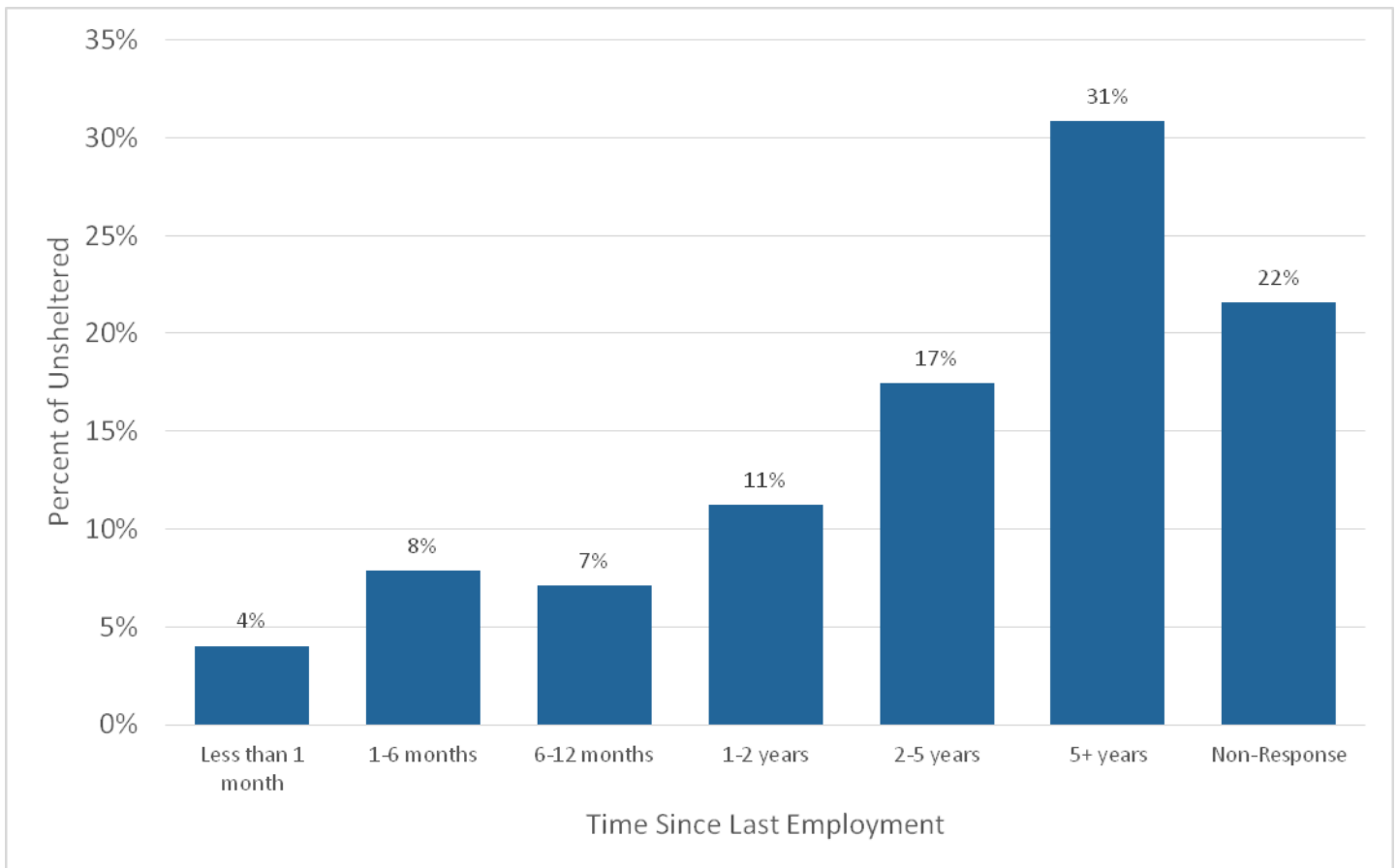
Homeless For A Year or Longer

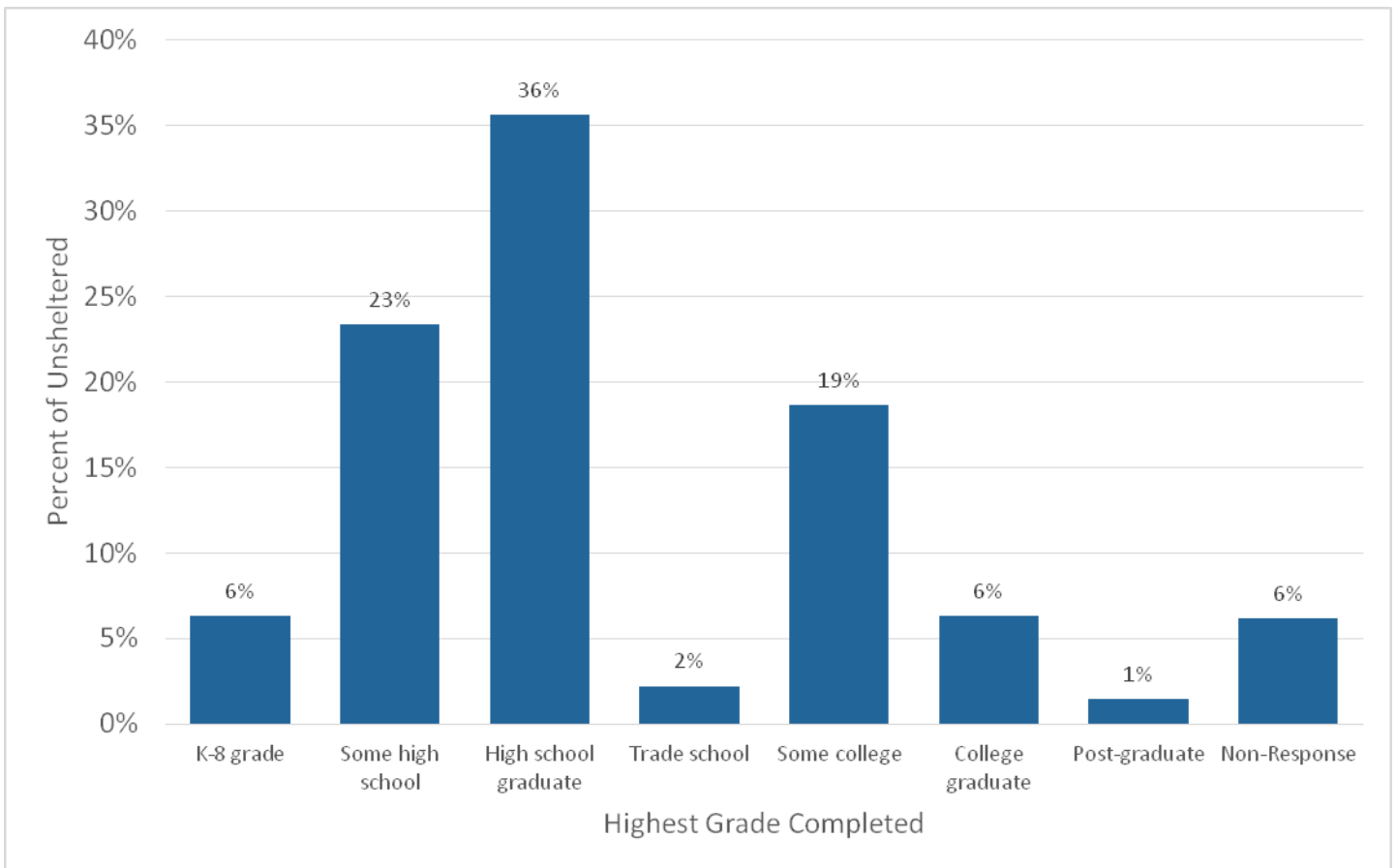
Time Since Last Employment

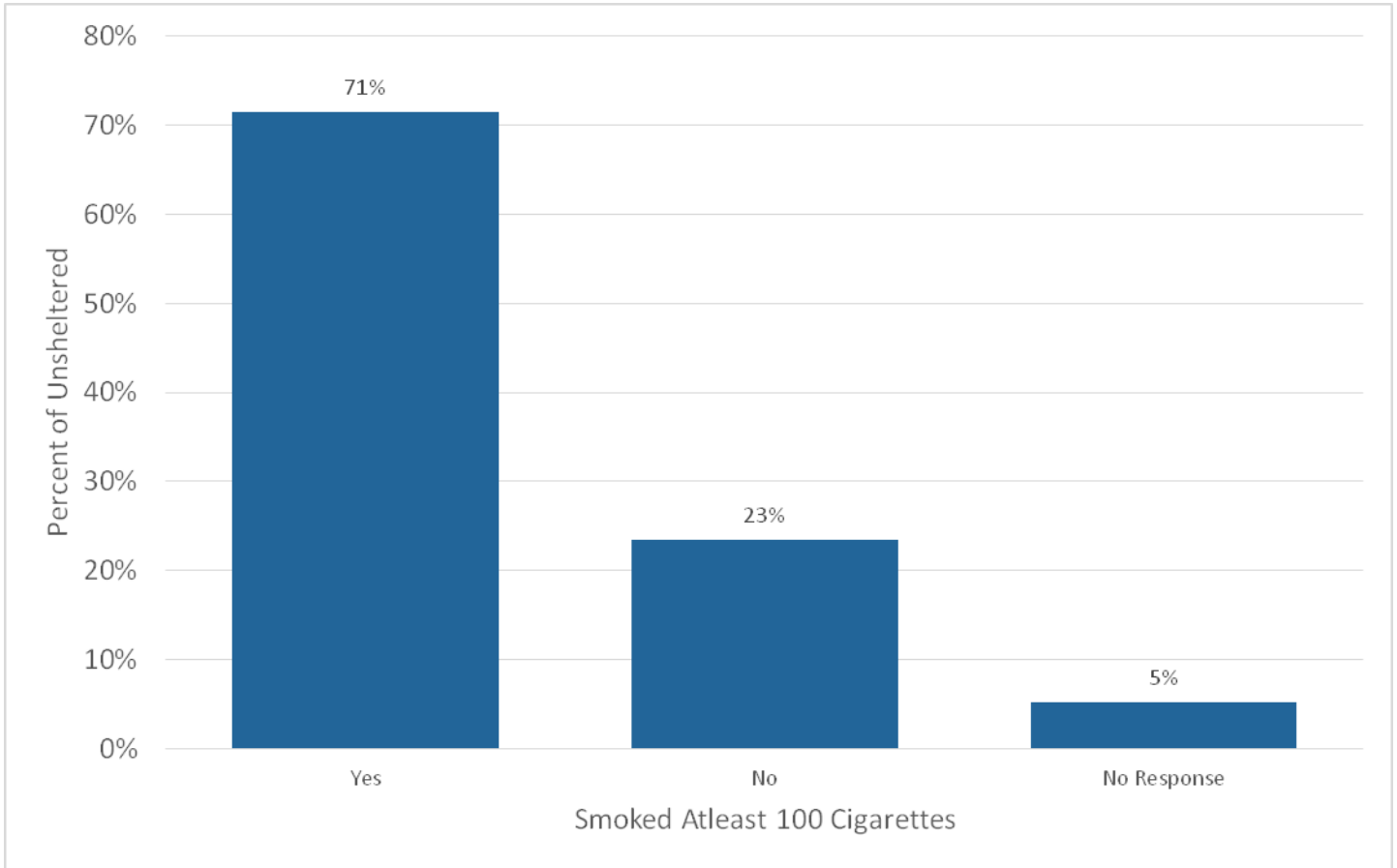

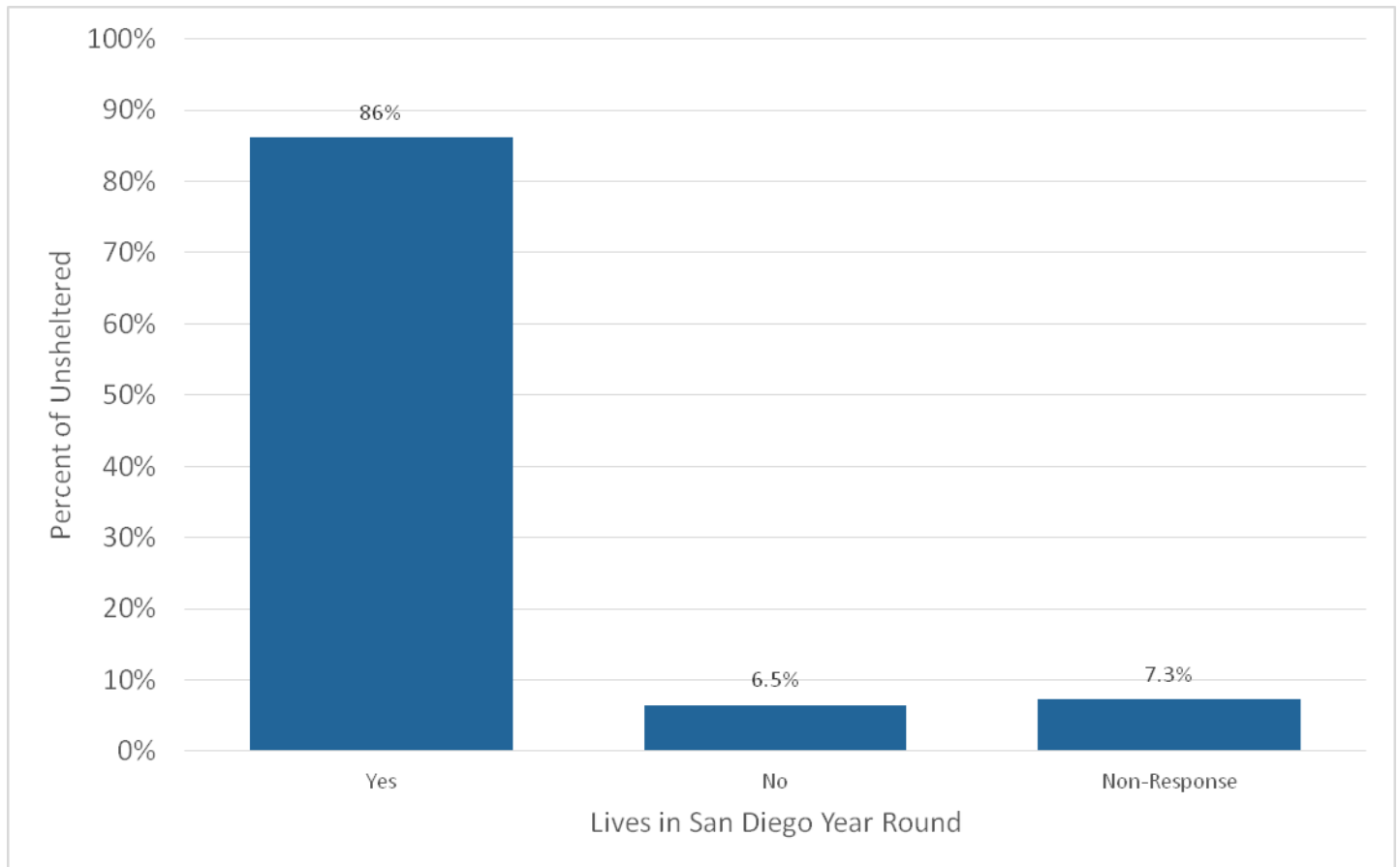


70% of the unsheltered homeless reported having smoked at least 100 cigarettes during their life.

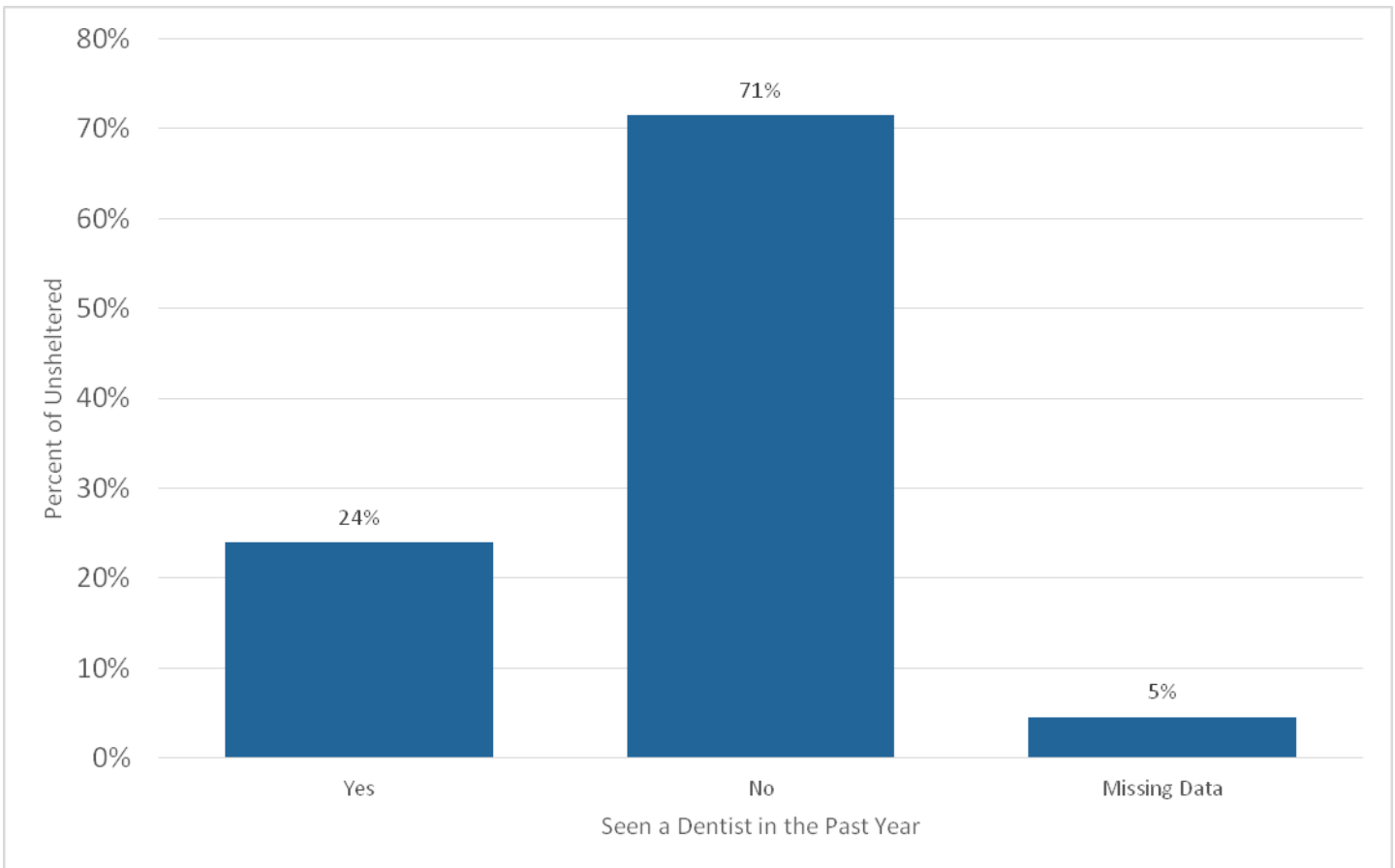
Lives in San Diego County Year Round

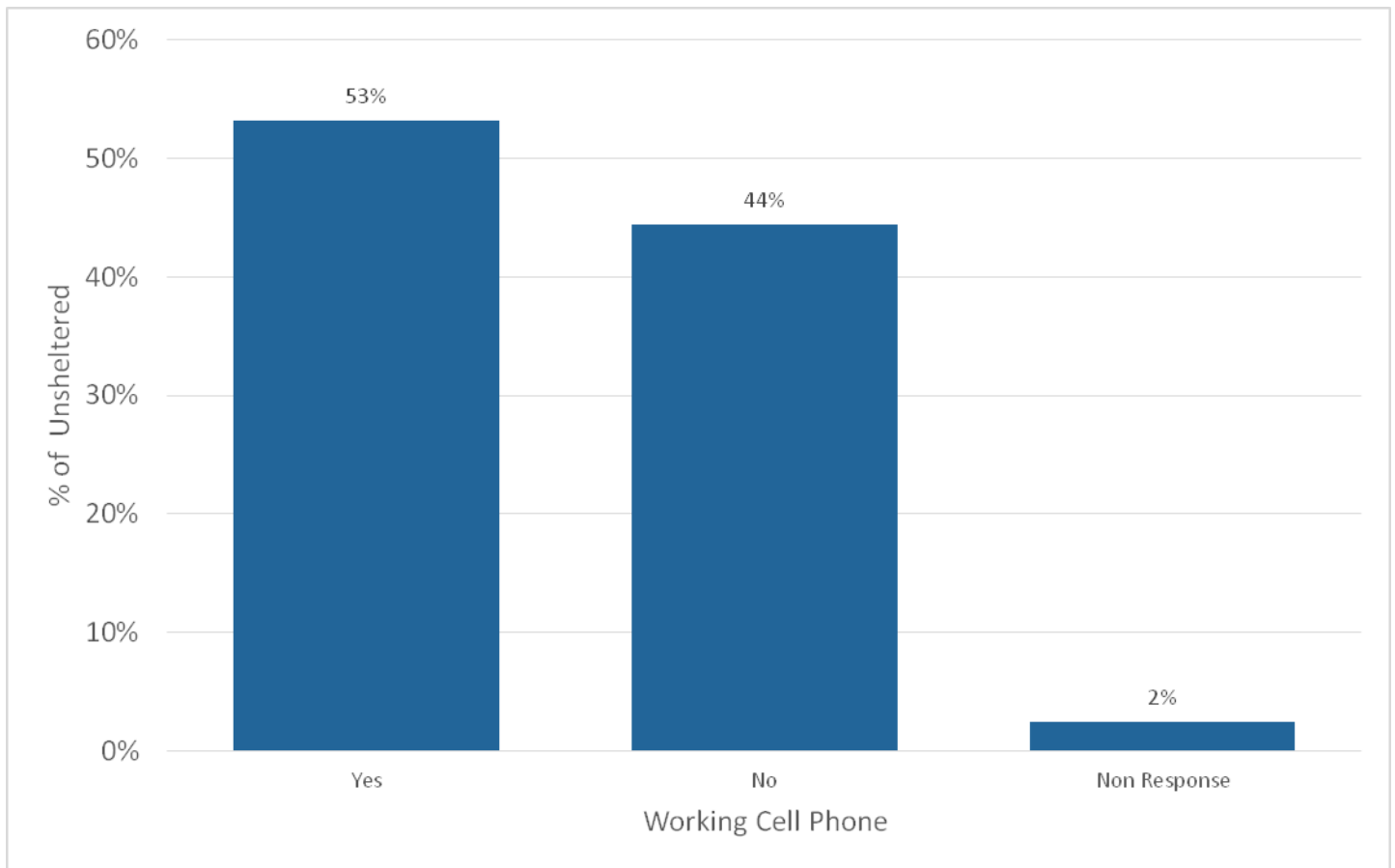

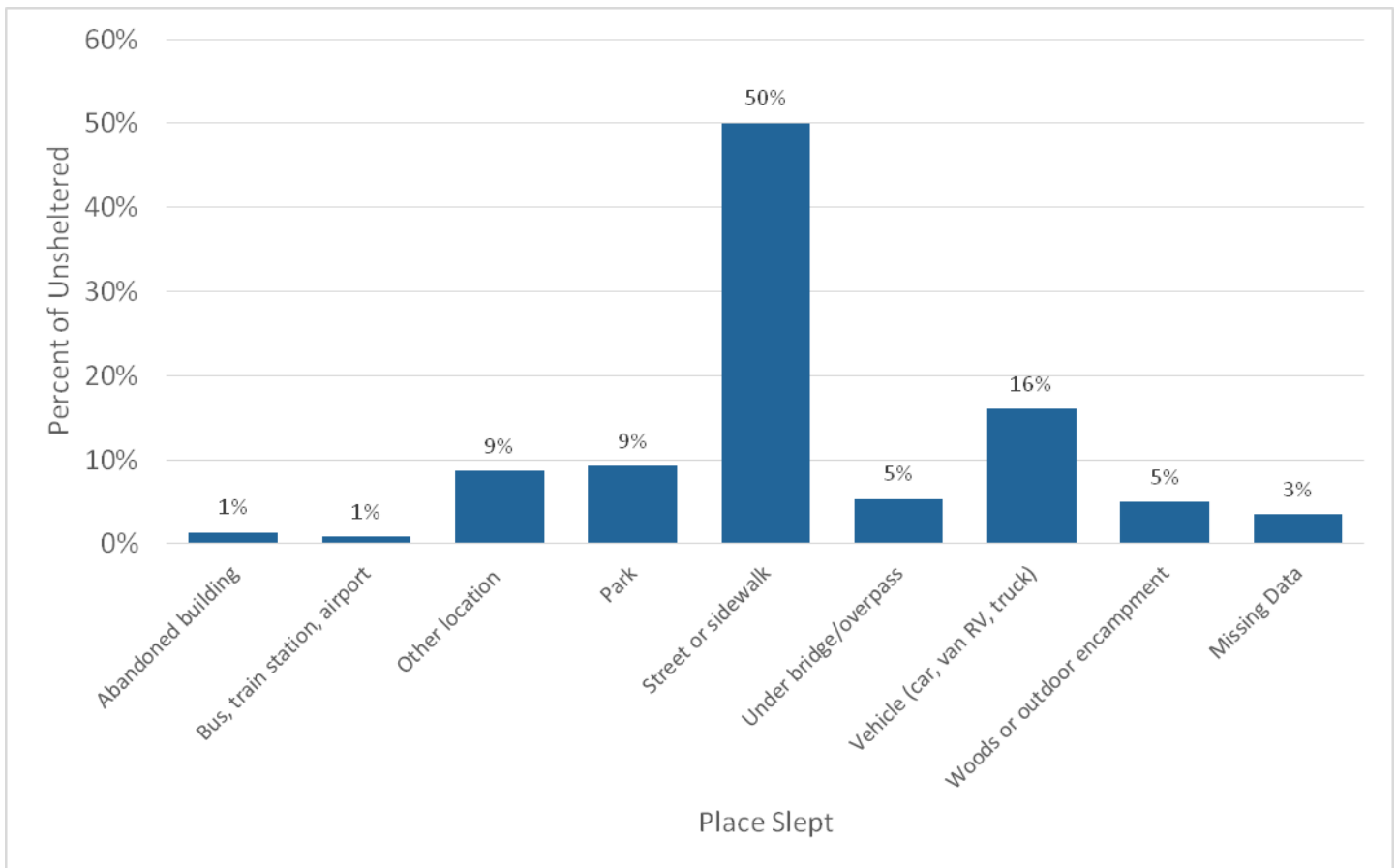

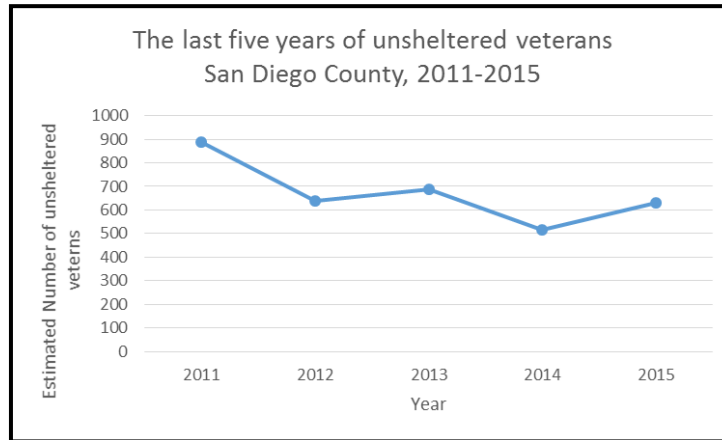

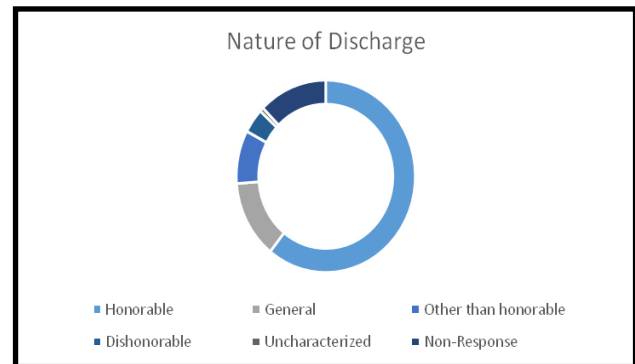
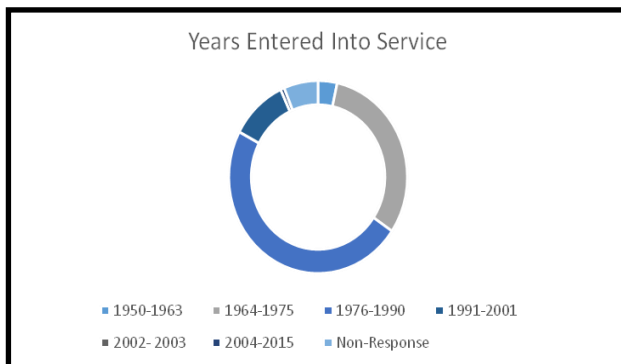


Unsheltered Veterans

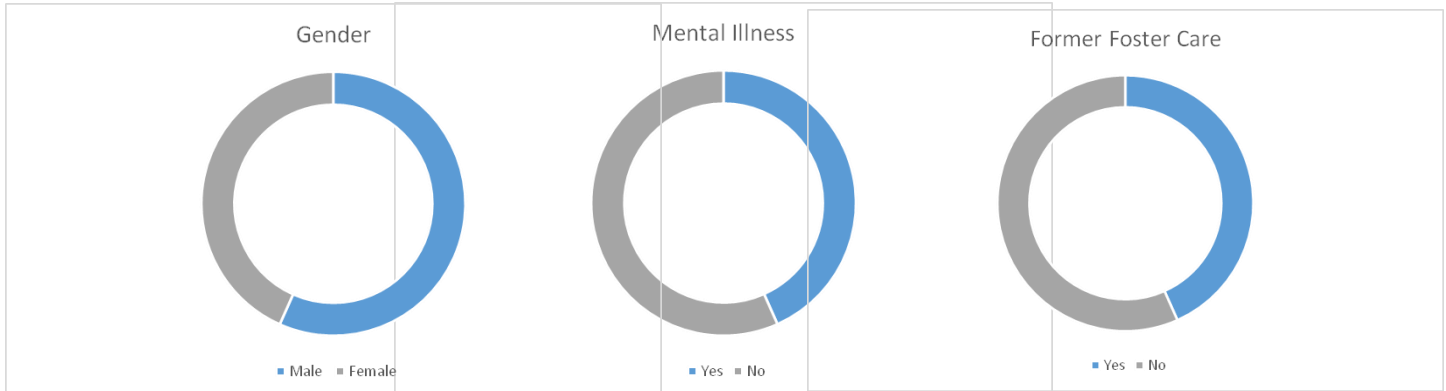
The majority of unsheltered homeless veterans were honorably discharged; with 4% being dishonorably discharged.

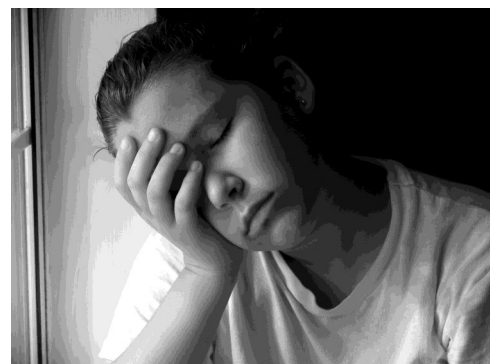

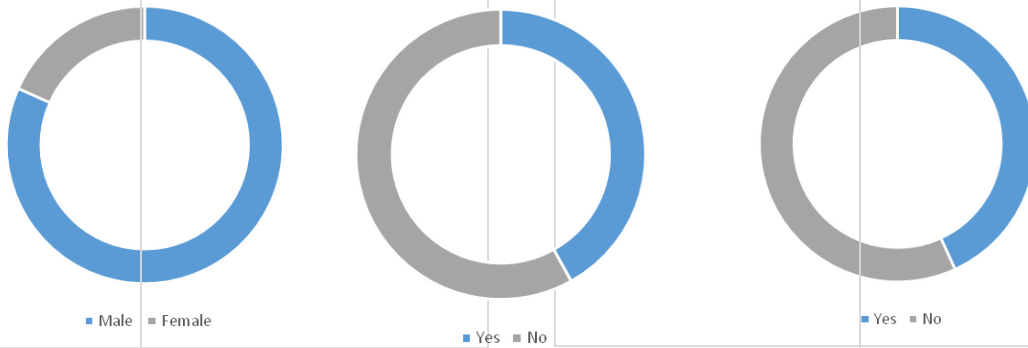

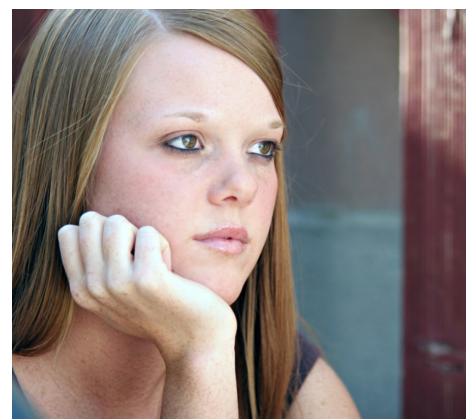

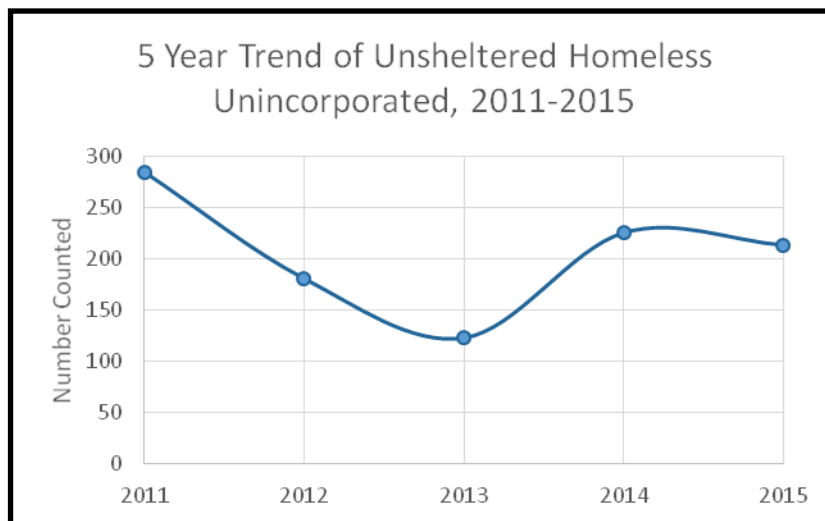
